



COUNCIL RECOGNISES EFFORTS OF ALL VOLUNTEERS – NATIONAL VOLUNTEER WEEK

National Volunteer Week is the annual celebration to acknowledge the generous contribution of volunteers. The theme for National Volunteer Week 2020 is “Changing Communities. Changing Lives”

This year’s theme is so pertinent to Greater Hume Council due to the impacts of drought, fires on ours and neighbouring communities and the lives and livelihoods of many of our residents and families. To be followed by the current COVID-19 situation change is unprecedented and it is now more important than ever to recognise and acknowledge the generous contribution and ongoing support of our many volunteers.

“Our communities have certainly been changed and many lives have been impacted, and in times like these our communities pull together and this year volunteering has played a major part,” said Mayor, Cr Heather Wilton. Holbrook and Culcairn SES, Holbrook-Walla Walla Meals on Wheels, Culcairn Red Cross, Henty Men’s Shed, Culcairn Uniting Church First Tuesday Club, Jindera Bushfire Brigade, Henty Lions Club and Jindera Pioneer Museum were identified as significant groups to be commended for the work that their many volunteers have done over a long time and particularly in recent times. Between these eight groups there are approximately 244 volunteers contributing their skills and experience to the Greater Hume communities. Combined, they have contributed more than 239 years of service to our communities with Henty Red Cross set to celebrate 85 years of service this year. “To all of our volunteers, Thank You,” said Mayor, Cr Heather Wilton.

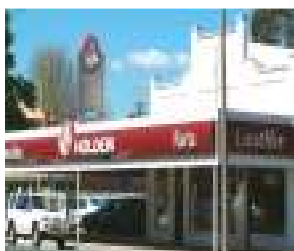

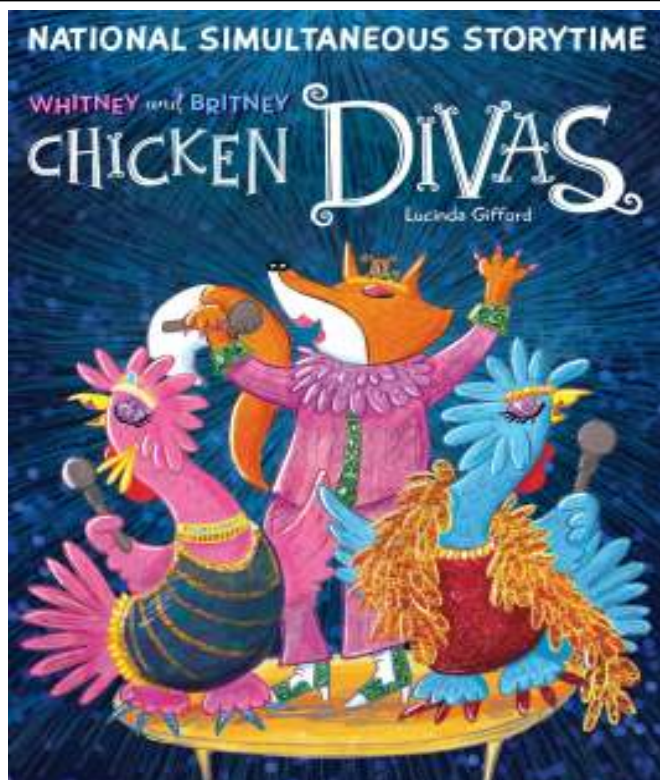

- * There will be a four person limit in the library.

PLANT PICK PLATE

Last December I wrote of my disappointment at not having the first of the season tomatoes in my garden ready to pick for Christmas. I attributed this to the cool spring/summer period and was unsure if I would get a tomato crop at all. The Mortgage Lifter and Tommy Toe varieties I had planted were healthy tall and leafy but the flowers had dropped.

Come January it was apparent my apprehension was ill founded with both varieties producing flowers for a second time then by February the four tomato plants were producing beautiful fruit. I was amazed and delighted at how resilient the plants were. The Tommy Toes were first providing us with round sweet bite sized fruit then the Mortgage with their trademark large juicy palm sized beauties which filled our sandwiches. The warm early autumn months quickly pushed the plants into full production and me into the kitchen cutting up and cooking the excess tomatoes to make Passata. I like my Passata spicy to compliment the richness of the tomatoes, a new recipe this year that it is absolutely delicious. In order to free up freezer space I bottled the Passata which will be added to pasta and hot pots, as a condiment sauce and to dilute with chicken stock for warming winter soups.

On reflection it is just as well I persisted and continued to nurture this crop as the tomatoes have provided us with mouthwatering produce for 5 months with the last of the green tomatoes ripening in the sun on my window sill and also preserving enough Passata to see us through until the next crop, hopefully. Great news! The Anglican Op Shop furniture section is now open. Furniture sales are now done at the rear of the main shop. You can access it by coming in the front door of the main shop and walking through to the rear. We are still under Covid 19 restrictions, but don't let that stop you from being socially distant whilst you peruse the vast amount of goods on display. There are moves afoot to try to return to 5 day a week trading. This of course depends on our untiring volunteers and we are still a little nervous about the virus.

The expected new hours will be Monday to Friday from 10 AM till 3 PM. Saturday is pending at this stage.

We are now welcoming donations to both the main shop and the furniture section. There are some changes from the old shop, the main one being that we no longer pick up or deliver furniture. This is because we no longer have the manpower. We need you to bring your donations during opening hours and can only accept good quality goods after we inspect them. PLEASE DO NOT DROP FURNITURE OFF AFTER HOURS. There are many goods we cannot accept and these include children's cots, used mattresses, strollers and prams, car seats and knives.

If you purchase an item of furniture, you must pay for it straight away and you will be given a written receipt for it. If you need time to organise someone to pick it up, we will hold it for up to seven days unless we make a further arrangement. The person picking it up must bring the paid receipt and present it before we release the goods.

Thank you all for your generosity and patience while we went through the shift and we look forward to serving you as individuals and as the wider community.
