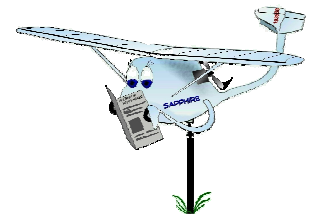

DOES YOUR CLUB/GROUP WANT TO MAKE SOME HEALTHY CHANGES, BUT NOT SURE HOW?



Holbrook Healthy Towns is offering up to \$400 to support local clubs and groups make some healthy changes to their catering for club events and activities.

Holbrook, one of five challengers in the 2020 Healthy Towns Challenge has allocated some funding to assist local clubs and groups to come up with their own unique “healthy catering policy”.

As we transition back from COVID-19 it is a great opportunity for clubs and groups to review their operations, including catering.

“We want as many clubs and groups as possible to have input into what a “healthier” catering policy should look like. We know that heart disease, diabetes, bowel cancer, obesity and lack of regular exercise are increasing and negatively impact quality of life. Making some small changes and providing some healthy options can make a big difference.” Community Services Manager, Lynnette O’Reilly said. Up to \$400 is offered to clubs who come on board and have input into the development of the policy with the support of NSW Health. In return, the funding can be used by the club/group for healthy food options and to implement the policy in their upcoming events and activities.

Nominate at least 2 members from your club to be involved in developing the policy. We are now back on track to progress with the challenge now ending in December with plenty of time to implement the events and activities. 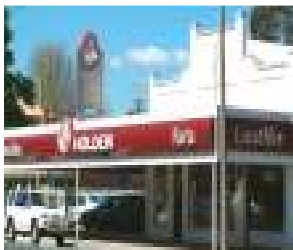

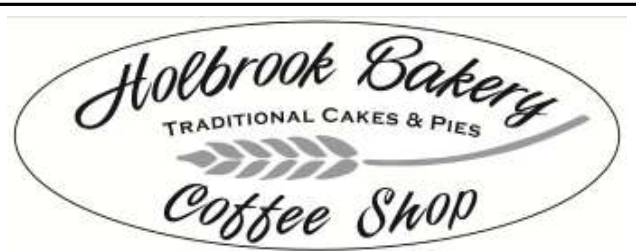

BOOK REVIEW

The Mercies by Kiran Millwood Hargrave

This atmospheric and gripping story takes place on the remote Norwegian island of Vardo in the district of Finnmark during the early 1600s.

On Christmas eve the sea around Vardo and 40 of its menfolk, are consumed by a violent storm. The widows cope by taking on the men's work to feed themselves through the harsh winter. The kirke would rather see them starve than upset the traditions of hundreds of years. The stronger women of the community persevere until an overseer is employed to look after the town. Commissioner Absalom Cornet noted witch-hunter from Scotland, arrives with his Norwegian wife on a mission to root out all the witches and heretics that abound in a country yet to be fully converted to Christianity.

Ursula his wife, forms a friendship with Maren, one of the widows and when her husband arrests two women for witchcraft, fear of her sadistic husband

HOLBROOK LANDCARE

Adaptive Farming Webinar: Filming took place last week for the second in our series of webinars on some of our local farmers who are making conscious decisions about how they manage their properties in order to meet the challenges of a changing environment. This webinar will be held later this month so keep a look out for notifications if you are interested in joining the conversation.

Please be conscious of contaminants such as dirt and rocks when using our Silage Wrap Recycling Program. We strongly urge all landholders who are making use of the Hay & Silage Wrap Recycling program to take note of the message we have received from Plastic Forests about contaminants in the silage wrap and grain bags. It is important that we work with Plastic Forests to enable them to process these waste products. If we didn't have this company working with us to help reduce the problem of disposing of silage wrap and baling twine there would be a far greater problem for landholders with disposal. From this moment on Plastic Forests are only accepting bagged silage film and separately bagged polypropylene twine. Plastic Forests are no longer accepting grain bags as there is too much dirt and rocks which will damage and wear out the processing equipment.

PLANT PICK PLATE

Now that the cold weather has arrived the brassicas you have planted should be well on the way to producing super food leaves and succulent, nutritious full heads. No doubt there are other vegies in your garden but at this time of the year the garden tasks have become significantly less. This is the case in my garden so I am taking this time to plan my spring plantings. I have been browsing through my seed catalogue and discovered over 20 bean varieties suitable for Sept/Oct plantings. The only beans I have had success with are Broad Beans "Aquadulce" which love the colder months. So surely out of this large group I can find at least one variety of bean suited to my garden. The bush bean does not require staking or trellising and has a compact growing habit which is ideal for pots and small garden beds. The pod colours range from butter through to violet, red, lemon/purple streaked and of course green. The inside bean can vary from white, brown or maroon as well as attractive speckles and dual colours, all are easily dried for future use.

The climbing bean by contrast, are just as the name suggests requiring trellising or fence support. The pods are equally varied in colour as are the beans with many varieties stringless. Thank goodness, as back in the day I recall only string beans being available from the grocer. Studying the pod to determine which side was stringed I usually ended up peeling both sides resulting in the beans falling from the pods during cooking. This narrows down my selection. Definitely a stringless variety and call me traditional but I like my beans green. I have room for a trellis which leaves me 4 to choose from. I guess it will be the "Lazy Housewife" variety simply because of its quirky name.
