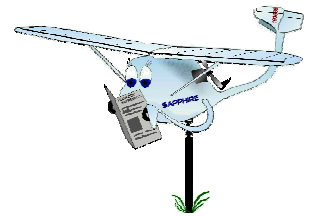

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT AT HOLBROOK HEALTH SERVICE

The team at Holbrook Health service have farewelled Dr Adebayo Adeyelu and his family with their relocation to South Australia in the last month. Dr Wah Wah Soe continues to provide quality General Practice medical support to Holbrook Health Service including the Harry Jarvis Wing. At Holbrook Health Service we have a skilled team of nursing staff to support Emergency Department Presentations, hospital admissions and residential aged care services. Murrumbidgee Local Health District has highly trained Emergency Registered Nurses staffing emergency departments across the region, including Holbrook Health Service. Emergency Registered Nurses have completed an intensive training program in First Line Emergency Care (FLECC).

The six month program includes a theoretical component through the Australian College of Nursing and a clinical component. The course prepares and credentials rural and remote Registered Nurses as an Advanced Clinical Nurse (ACN) to ensure early appropriate management of acute and life threatening conditions, and to relieve pain and discomfort for patients at hospitals where Medical Officers are not immediately available.

Emergency Department staff are supported 24 hours a day, 7 days a week by the Remote Medical Consultation Service and the Critical Care Advisory Service. These services link health care consumers across MLHD's 33 facilities to world class models of care and highly skilled clinicians using advanced digitalised telecommunications platforms.

The Remote Medical Consultation Service supports clinicians in outlying hospitals by prescribing medical treatments and first aid advice and identifying when further care is required. This is a General Practice Telehealth service to support Emergency presentations and hospital admissions when our General Practice Visiting Medical Officer (GP VMO) is unavailable. The Remote Medical Service is a service that provides quality medical services to enhance our patient services provided at Holbrook Health Service.

The MLHD Critical Care Advisory Service (CCAS) facilitates critical care expertise from senior critical care clinicians at the Wagga Wagga Base Hospital (WWBH) using telehealth. In some

cases due to the limited number of critical patient presentations, staff can lack recent experience in dealing with these patients so the CCAS is there to support them. Holbrook Health Service's Emergency Department is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and reminds residents that in an emergency they should call 000 for an Ambulance, or come straight to the ED. HealthDirect is also available on 1800 022 222 for general advice and information.

Holbrook Skatepark Landscape Design Competition – Update

The deadline for the Skatepark Design Competition has now closed, and we are loving the ideas created by you all! The designs will be displayed at the Holbrook Library for you all to see and to vote on which design or elements of the design you like. You can place your vote or make a suggestion in the voting box that will be provided. 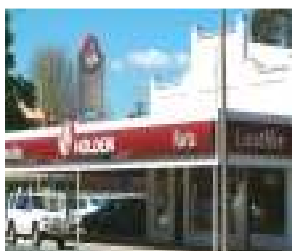

CHANGES COMING AT KNOX

At their AGM recently, members of the Knox Uniting Church decided to ask the Riverina Presbytery to close them as a formal congregation. While there will be no immediate changes, when the closure is finalized it will mean that the overall management of the church buildings and finances will be by the Riverina Presbytery (based in Wagga). Ownership of the buildings remains with the Uniting Church Property Trust.

Locals will probably not notice much difference! Members of the Uniting Church will still enjoy the support of the Southern Region community minister, Rev Yvonne Ghavalas, and the Presbytery Minister, Rev Nigel Hawken. Members of the congregation with the support and guidance of these ministers will work out how best to proceed in the future. The church and halls can still be used for funerals and weddings and community hire.

The Centenary of the building of the spired Knox church was held in 2000. The original church was the hall, opened in 1873 as the Presbyterian Church in Germanton, and now used as a worship and community space. The other buildings that form part of the Knox block are the Manse (now leased), the Mary Lundy hall which was originally built in 1929 as the Sunday school, and the toilet/storage block.

In 1977 the Uniting Church in Australia was established, and the Presbyterian congregation in Holbrook has been a congregation of the UCA since then.

Chair of the Congregation, Jenny Parer, said that the load of running a congregation had become too much for the small group of ageing parishioners. "There hasn't been a minister for many years, the last one was Russell Dancey who began his ministry in 1996, followed by Judy Harrison, a lay minister, in 2004. "This has been a very difficult decision, and a long time in the making. However, being realistic, and perhaps being pushed along by the effects of COVID19, we think this closure has become inevitable. We hope that the change will be a positive one, sometimes it takes a big change to move us along and do things in a different way. The Uniting Church is certainly looking at ways it can "do church" differently and this could breathe new life into us."

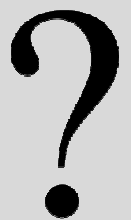

GREATER HUME COUNCIL - TAFE NSW SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM TO HELP PLUG CHILDCARE SKILLS GAP



Locals interested in a career in the booming childcare sector are being offered an opportunity to “earn and learn” at the same time, thanks to a unique scholarship program offered by Greater Hume Council and TAFE NSW.

Over the past 18 months, Greater Hume Council has responded to community demand by taking over operations of long day care services in Walla Walla, Henty and Holbrook but is now faced with a staffing shortage.

The childcare sector, particularly in regional areas, has long grappled with a skills shortage, with the TAFE NSW Jobs of the Future report finding “early childhood educator” would be one of the fastest growing professions in the Murray region between 2018 and 2021.

In partnership with TAFE NSW, Greater Hume Council has launched five new scholarships to locals, allowing recipients to work on the job while receiving free tuition for a Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care through TAFE NSW.

“It’s a great opportunity at a time when people have lost jobs and being able to study and work locally is becoming more attractive,” Greater Hume Council Mayor Cr Heather Wilton.

“Each scholarship recipient gets the cost of their course paid for by Greater Hume Council. Scholarship recipients are also rewarded with opportunities for paid work placement as an integral part of the program.”

Cr Wilton said successful applicants would then have the option to work in one of the centres part-time or full-time.

TAFE NSW Early Childhood Team Leader Justine Poidevin encouraged locals to consider applying for the scholarship.

“All of our early childhood teachers have worked extensively, or are currently working, in the sector and the course is extremely hands-on and practical,” Ms Poidevin said.

“With the jobs market becoming increasingly uncertain, this is a wonderful opportunity to get a running start into an industry where jobs are plentiful and the personal rewards of the work are rich.

RECONSTRUCTION WORK BEGINS ON COPPABELLA ROAD

Greater Hume Council has received funding from the NSW Government’s Restart Fund for the reconstruction of a section of Coppabella Road between Maginnity’s Gap Road and Short cut Road.

This work will include realignment works, culvert replacements, extensive earthworks, road sealing and a new bridge over Back Creek.

The upgrade is to improve access for the logging industry in the area and is part of the South West Slopes Timber industry Road Network Project.

Due to the extent of the works required, it will be necessary to close that section of Coppabella Road to through traffic for an extended period to expedite the works. This will assist contractors to meet some tight deadlines for completion of the works.

It is expected the roadworks will commence in early October 2020 and be complete by late March 2021.

LEST WE FORGET - RONALD HORE

In the interest of preserving our local military history, we will be publishing some articles on servicemen and women from throughout the Greater Hume Shire area. Australia has participated in numerous wars and it is important to remember the sacrifice made by the servicemen and women, their families and their local community.

This article will be about Flight Sergeant Ronald Hore who was the son of Mr. and Mrs. A. Hore of 'Lockerbie', Little Billabong. In the years before the Second World War broke out, Hore worked as a station agent and clerk.

Hore enlisted in the Royal Australian Air Force in early 1942. After carrying out training in Canada, Hore embarked for the United Kingdom where he was posted to No. 467 Squadron in which he was a Wireless Operator Air Gunner. The No. 467 Squadron was a bomber Squadron, flying missions over North West Europe.

On the night of the 12th August 1944, Ronald Hore with six other members of his Lancaster bomber crew took off to carry out an attack against a factory in Russelsheim, Germany, known to be manufacturing flying bombs. The crew failed to return to base after bombing their target, for over Belgium, they had been intercepted by the enemy, believed to be the 91st aircraft to be shot down by the Luftwaffe night fighter ace pilot; Heinz-Wolfgang Schnauffer. An explosion had occurred and there was a report by the rear gunner that there was a fire in the fuselage. The explosion caused the aircraft to uncontrollably dive down 600 meters in just moments. The pilot instructed the crew to abandon the Lancaster and with considerable difficulty two crew members were able to escape, yet the five other remaining crew members including Hore were killed in the crash.

Ronald Hore and the other non-surviving crew members were buried by Germans. After the end of the war, the bodies of these men were exhumed, properly identified and laid to rest in Hotton War Cemetery, Belgium. Flight Sergeant Hore's headstone inscribes these words that mark his duty well done; 'honour and everlasting glory to one who always did his duty'.

SURVEY TO HELP SHAPE PLAN FOR REGIONAL SOFTWOOD INDUSTRY

Serving an industry whose gross economic contribution to the region is more than \$2 billion per year, the South West Slopes Forestry Hub (the Hub) is asking the community to complete a survey as it assists with planning the softwood-plantation industry's future after the fires and through to 2050.

South West Slopes Forestry Hub chair, Peter Crowe said the Hub is one of nine to each receive \$1million over three years under the Australian government's National Forest Industries Plan (a billion trees for jobs and growth program). "Obviously, with the industry in our region supporting 1,917 jobs directly and 5,375 when you add in the flow-on jobs, it's important that we have a solid plan for the next 30 years," Mr Crowe said.

There is currently about 125,000 hectares of land available for growing softwood plantation timber in the SW Slopes region. This represents about 3% of the catchment areas above Lake Hume and Burrinjuck Dam. "Even before the fires, the local plantations did not produce enough wood to meet the demands of the local processors. With the new plantation establishment rate static, about 30% of the region's current wood needs are being met by other regions.

This adds to costs and has significant transport, environmental and community disadvantages locally," he said. "Due to the impacts of the 2020 fires, the wood from the plantations has been significantly reduced for the next 20-30 years as about 40% of the plantation area was burnt. The Hub has a role to play in assisting with the recovery and industry re-alignment processes that will be required to chart a path forward. "In addition to re-establishing the burnt areas, it has been estimated that an additional 30,000 hectares or 30 million new trees are required over the next 10 years to meet this region's demand," he said. Mr Crowe said the Hub's goal is to assist with identifying opportunities to expand the local industry. "Part of the Hub's role will be to identify constraints and impediments that need to be addressed. This will involve increasing the amount of wood generated from the softwood plantations, encouraging the development of appropriate skills, providing adequate infrastructure and therefore, deliver employment and economic growth to the communities throughout the Hub region," he said. "A key element of this is community engagement. Hearing the views of local people will help us to understand the interests of the communities and increase awareness of the industry, the facts about softwood plantations and the sector's contribution to jobs and community wellbeing. "Therefore, we would like to hear from as many people through out the South West Slopes area as possible. We encourage people to fill in the survey and share it with their family and friends." LOCAL MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORTS CONTINUING TO GROW

With October marking national Mental Health Month, MPHNSW is reminding people of the different resources and support services available in the region, which have been boosted by increased Commonwealth funding during the COVID-19 pandemic. "We know many regional Australians will experience a mental health issue during their lifetime, and those who don't will most likely know someone who does," Deputy Prime Minister and Federal Member for Riverina, The Hon Michael McCormack MP said. "Since 30 January, the Federal Government has provided an extra \$500 million for mental health services and support around the country. Locally, we've seen additional funding for headspace; while a range of other services have been able to expand." MPHNSW offers QPR (Question Persuade Refer) suicide prevention training for free to people living in the Murrumbidgee region. The training is online, takes less than an hour to complete, and can be done at any time. Another key resource available is MapMyRecovery, an online service directory allowing people to quickly find the most appropriate service and information to meet their health needs. The resource was developed by the Murrumbidgee Mental Health and Drug and Alcohol Alliance. MPHNSW also commissions a variety of mental health services throughout the Murrumbidgee region, which are free to access. "We are committed to ensuring people receive the right services at the right time and in the right place, therefore we commission services within a stepped care approach," MPHNSW CEO Melissa Neal said. "In a stepped care approach, a person seeking support is connected to the services that meet their needs and as their needs change, the services change with them. The MyStep to mental wellbeing program is offered across the region and includes low, medium and high intensity services with a mix of face to face and telehealth delivery." While mental health issues can be very isolating, connecting with people and having conversations about mental health can minimise stigma and encourage people to seek help when they need it, Ms Neal said. "Tough times can happen to anyone, but nobody should feel alone," she said. "It's always okay to ask for help. Talk to your family and friends and let them know how you're feeling. Check in with family and friends and ask if they are okay." For more information about services available across the region, visit www.mphn.org.au. 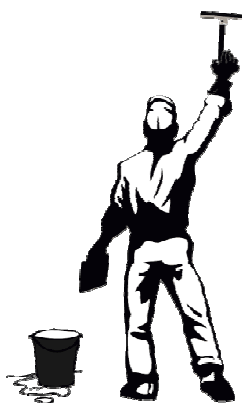
