

CHOC-MINT ICE-CREAM CAKES

Makes 12

Ingredients:

125g plain chocolate biscuits

50g unsalted butter, melted

600ml thickened cream 395g can sweetened condensed milk

1½ tspn peppermint extract

2-3 drops green food colour, to tint

34 cup chocolate chips, chopped

100g good quality dark chocolate, chopped 1½ tspn soft spreadable butter or vegetable oil

Peppermint Crisp bar, finely chopped, to serve

Method:

1. Line the bases of a 12-hole, 1/3 cup-capacity non-stick muffin pan with baking paper.

2. Place biscuits in a food processor. Process until fine crumbs form. Add melted butter and process until combined. Press mixture into bases of prepared pan holes. Refrigerate until required.

3. Using an electric mixer, beat cream until soft peaks form.


4. Place condensed milk, peppermint extract, a little food colouring and chopped chocolate chips in a large bowl. Stir to combine. Fold condensed milk mixture into thickened cream. Spoon the Watch this space for any changes in the next cream mixture into the prepared muffin holes until three-quarters full.

> 5. Using an electric mixer, beat remaining cream mixture until firm peaks form. Transfer to a piping bag fitted with a large star nozzle. Working quickly, pipe cream mixture over mixture in muffin holes. Freeze for 6 hours or overnight until frozen.

> 6. Just before you're ready to serve, place dark chocolate and Spreadable in a heatproof bowl over a saucepan of simmering water (make sure the base of the bowl doesn't touch the water). Stir until chocolate has melted.

> 7. Remove ice cream from muffin pans. Drizzle with cooled chocolate sauce and serve scattered with the chopped peppermint crisp.

> You could replace the chocolate chips with chopped candy canes for an extra strong mint flavour. (Recipe supplied by Western Star)



PLANT PICK PLATE

In the past couple of months I have heard conversations by gardeners debating the optimum time to plant tomatoes in our area. This topic is more popular than the weather and basically it has to do with possible late frosts which could wipe out the



crop. Melbourne Cup Day, the first Tuesday in November seems to be the trigger to plant but I disagree.

This is far too late in the season to plant tomatoes. If you have frost protection barriers at the ready, I am convinced that early to mid October is more favourable and this is why. Come October, the soil has warmed with consistent moisture retention throughout allowing the young roots of the tomato to establish, absorb the nutrients and penetrate deeper before the day temperature rises and the soil surface begins to dry. Earlier planting is not about harvesting tomatoes ready for Christmas, rather it provides the plant with a head start for healthy, vigorous growth and increased summer heat resilience resulting in sweet, tasty fruit.

As a comparison, I have excess tomato plants still in their pots receiving the same liquid nutrients, yet they have become root bound, stunted in growth and discoloured in the leaves. They are not thriving as their brothers in the ground which have grown tall, bushy and just showing flowers. The key is for the gardener to provide initial frost protection, liquid fertilisers every 2 - 3 weeks, keep an acute eye on pests and regularly tether the plant. A healthy tall plant with delicious tomatoes will develop when October planted.

Of course, this is just my opinion and many gardeners will vehemently disagree but maybe in future plantings a little variation to planting time could be a worthwhile exercise. Passionate Gardener. June


activities were kayaking, rock climbing and the mud run! We also had fun playing with other schools during the night activities.

THUNDERSTORM ASTHMA

Spring and early summer comes with a high incidence of thunderstorm activity. With this, brings thunderstorm asthma. Thunderstorm asthma occurs



when high pollen counts are in the air and the pollen is then swept up into the air, and these extreme high pollen counts are then swept back down to ground level where people then breathe them in. People who are of higher risk of a sudden asthma flare-up triggered by a thunderstorm are people who experience:

- Seasonal hay fever
- Current asthma
- A history of asthma or respiratory conditions e.g COPD
- Undiagnosed asthma

The chance of having thunderstorm asthma is highest for adults who are sensitive to grass pollen and have seasonal hay fever (with or without known asthma). The worst outcomes are in people with poorly controlled asthma.

If you know you have asthma, always carry your asthma puffer and spacer with you at all times, use your preventer, keep your hay fever under control and try to stay indoors with the windows and doors closed during the storm period, and follow your asthma action plan that you have from your GP. If you don't have an up to date asthma action plan with your GP, please go and see your GP.

If a person is requiring salbutamol (Ventolin), always use a spacer and use the following as a guide for how many puffs are required:

- Children aged 1-6 years: 4-6 puffs
- Children aged 6-12 years: 6-12 puffs
- Children aged over 12 and adults: 12 puffs

Please be aware that thunderstorm asthma can also affect people who have not had asthma before. If you have breathing difficulties call 000 or go to your nearest hospital emergency department. Here at Holbrook hospital, we are always available and prepared, and are given advice when thunderstorm asthma is likely to be prevalent. You can always check the MLHD facebook page to keep up to date with thunderstorm asthma activity or you can receive an SMS alert when the pollen counts are high and thunderstorms are predicted, go to https://science.csu.edu.au/asthma to register, or text the word Asthma to 0417 115 876 Regards, Helen
