#### HOLBROOK LANDCARE

#### Great Southern Bioblitz 2023 - Love your Creek! What an enormous weekend! The HLN Bioblitz team (Peter, Kylie and Jo) spent Friday to Monday blitzing the Upper Billabong.

We had 13 people join the Greater Hume project and 9 in the Upper Murray. The theme of the Greater Hume bioblitz was "Love your Creek" and we also asked people to join the longer term 'Refreshing Rivers Upper Billabong" iNaturalist project so we can share our observations in the catchment and build a great database of the

plants, animals and other organisms that live here. We blitzed the Ten Mile Creek at the Ian Geddes Bush Reserve with the local schools - we even found a squirrel glider in one of the nest boxes!



The St Pats kids pulled a carp gudgeon out of the creek - great to see this small native fish still surviving.


Farm-Scale Natural Capital Accounting Field Day: Woomargama Station hosted the LaTrobe

University group who are working on a Farm Scale Natural Capital Account framework to allow document farm businesses to their environmental performance and track it over time.

As we all know supply chains are beginning to ask the questions as environmental benchmarking, especially emissions profiles, are becoming reportable up the chain. Getting a good way of collecting and tracking information is becoming more and more important.

An account on its own is interesting, but the real value will be in being able to show either maintenance of values or improvement over time. Another standout for me was the statistic that across the whole project (50 farms Vic/NSW), they consistently found 70% of the expected bird species for the area in the surveys - this shows valuable farm landscapes iust how are. Conservation cannot just be about national parks. LaTrobe University is having a results webinar to go through the project learnings on December 15<sup>th</sup> (1.00-4.00pm) and anyone is welcome to

#### FISCHER COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

The Fischer Community Leadership Program (FCLP) will be running in Greater Hume Council in 2024, with the program to be delivered twice over the year. The first delivery of the program will run as a new, two-day immersive workshop on Friday 21<sup>st</sup> and Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> March in Culcairn.

The program aims to enable and empower leadership within the community from the grassroots up. The focus is to develop leadership skills and create a group of community leaders that are equipped to take action and make a difference. Participation is open to all residents within Greater Hume, and the program is a wonderful opportunity to grow relationships across townships.

The immersive format will be hands-on, experiential, and focus on practical learning. Participants will be introduced to the skills, knowledge, and mindset needed for community leadership, as well as the requirements of a community project.

It is best suited to those who are:

- Interested in making a difference in their community.
- Current or emerging community leaders, including: captains, coaches and other sporting leaders, Local committee leaders, Emergency services volunteers, People wanting to make a difference in their community.

In addition to the two full day workshop, a further 4-hour session will be delivered in person, and 2 x 1 hour sessions will be delivered by Zoom, providing mentoring and guidance. Participants are also encouraged to come together for a local dinner after the first program day, to build relationships and strengthen their networks.

The program is delivered by Alpine Valleys Community Leadership in partnership with Federation and Greater Hume Councils, auspiced by the Border Trust, and made possible by the grant funding from the NSW Government Stronger Country Communities Fund Round 5. Through this funding, the participation cost is \$60.


