#### **HOLBROOK SHOW 2024**

Another year on and another local agricultural birthday, he be invited to open the show. show completed.

2024 was the 140<sup>th</sup> agricultural show in this town, and on the same site. The first proper show was held in 1882, after a successful ploughing competition had been run the previous year. It was felt that the local community needed an opportunity to display their prime animals, produce and agricultural skills so the show became this place. Over the years entertainment and more pavilion classes were introduced and the day grew into a true showcase of talents and skills. As the event grew, an additional two parcels of land were added to the original site, and the ground covered the area now known as the Holbrook Sporting Complex.

Unfortunately, this year's show saw a clash with the Sydney Royal, and a few other horse events, so the number of horses in the led and riding classes was adversely affected, although the Stockhorse classes and Fun Ring were very well supported. The clash with Sydney Royal was also the reason for the committee to make a decision to not run a cattle competition this year.



Mr Oliver Killalea officially opened the 2024 Holbrook Show. Oliver is a past show president and one of the Show Society Patrons, so it was fitting that, in the year he celebrated his 100th

We also took the opportunity to present Mrs Wilma Black with а Certificate of Appreciation, in recognition of her many, many years of entering her craft into various sections of the show pavilion.

### HOLBROOK LANDCARE

**Site Preparation and Tree Lots:** Now is the time to start seriously getting ready for any planting activities on the farm – ripping in a dry profile shatters the soil and allows it to settle before planting. 'Cloddy' rip lines can be a reason for failure – plants get planted, hit an air pocket and die. Once we have had some more rain, the rip lines can be sprayed with a knockdown ready for planting.

As it has got dry, it's tempting to open the gates to the revegetation areas. That is a strategy that we have even promoted in the past – using reveg areas as a haystack!

If you plant the revegetation with this in mind there is nothing wrong with that, but we now know that all grazing of reveg areas has an impact on the biodiversity value. ANU research has shown differences in patterns of species richness and individual species occurrence between grazed and ungrazed plantings (Lindenmayer et al 2018). So, if you have a block planted for biodiversity purposes, then grazing should be true crash grazing – large numbers for a short time. In practical terms this means you can open the gates for hours or days, but not weeks.

### **PLANT PICK PLATE**

I recently visited the Quercus community garden in Beechworth with the cheerful Holbrook community garden group. This garden was established in 2019 and is a true "Paddock to Plate" initiative. Not only is the fresh produce grown there readily available to the community, but excess is refrigerated with fresh produce from private gardens welcomed. Precooked frozen meals are also made available for the community. As volunteers guided us through the extensive garden, I was particularly interested in their composting methods. All these years I believed that I was good at composting, however apparently I have not been truly "COMPOSTING". A lot more planning, effort and muscle is required to create this valuable garden resource. Realising that the ratio of my dry materials to make a hot compost needed to increase, I scooped up many tubs of fallen Autumn leaves followed by a visit to the landscape yard for some manure compost. The pH is high in this mix so a handful of superphosphate and a measured quantity of sulphur I added to each layer in the composting bay. Once thoroughly watered I covered with lavers of shade cloth while making note to water and fork over the whole bay regularly to maintain the internal heat necessary to decompose. I can feel my muscles ache just at the thought. In contrast, my effortless cold compost method, where I add materials intermittently without turning takes longer, does not kill weed seeds and attracts bugs to the mix. However, no muscle required.

If my effort to "**COMPOST**" is effective, I will be rewarded with a fertile, friable and weed free mixture to apply to my garden in Spring and all the extra effort and muscle flexing will be worthwhile.
