BERT HAYNES INDUCTED INTO NSW AFL HALL OF FAME

Congratulations to Bert Haynes who was recently inducted into the NSW Australian Football Hall of Fame amongst other great inductees celebrating footballs best.

Bert chalked up 360 games for Holbrook and booted over 700 goals. He was captain-coach in 1977-78 and in 1981, played in the 1970 premiership team and was club best and fairest four times. The

towering ruck-forward was awarded the Upper Murray League's best and fairest player in 1976 when coaching Tumbarumba.

A true gentle giant, Bert's strengths were the way he read the game and his big engine.

When his playing days finished, Bert became President of Holbrook Football Club serving for ten years. He also served as Vice-president of the Hume Football League from 2005-2013.

PLANNED WORK ON COMMUNICATIONS TOWERS TO IMPACT INTERNET

For those Holbrook residents who live within 29km of the edge of the township and are using the nbn® Fixed Wireless network, there are some changes coming to the network as the wholesaler completes upgrades to enhance the experience and to give more homes and businesses in the community access to the service.

If you haven't had a notification already from the company that you purchase your Internet from, you might not be aware that the Holbrook tower has a **works window on Wednesday 22nd May and Thursday 23rd May**, which will require the service to be turned off to allow contractors to complete adjustments to the current infrastructure as part of the upgrade program. This means that you may have times across both days where you will not have service on your nbn® Fixed Wireless connection.

There are two windows of potential outages planned during Wednesday and Thursday which at this stage are noted as 9 hour windows from 8am in the morning. In most cases these are estimations that within scheduled window there may be an impact to accessing the Internet via the towers, but in many cases the outages are shorter and only when absolutely necessary.

This might be a good time to consider some other options for accessing the Internet during the day on these outage days, through the use of Hotspot connections on your mobile phone or a portable Hotspot device or even heading somewhere else to access the Internet if you've got some important tasks on.

PLANT PICK PLATE

Passionate gardeners will have already planted their winter Brassica vegetables which should be growing



tall and strong with some maybe even forming heads. This family includes cabbage, broccoli, Brussels sprouts and cauliflower. The latter is not my favourite and may not be popular with others either due to its strong cooking odour and a rather bland flavour, however during the cooler months the Cauliflower is one of the most economical and nutritious green vegetable available. You get a lot for your dollar. Therefore to enhance the eating experience it is necessary to dress the cauliflower up a bit with the addition of flavoured sauces and aromatic ingredients.

Now that you have your cauliflower, soak it in lightly salted water for 10 minutes to dislodge any insects. Break into large florets and cook in slightly salted water for about 8 minutes until just tender. Do not overcook, the pieces should be slightly firm. I have read cooking tips that use white sauce, sour cream or coconut cream as a dressing infused with a strong flavoured cheese, anchovies, sweet chilli, garlic or onion.

Alternatively, toppings of mashed hard boiled eggs, grated Parmesan or fresh herb seasoned bread crumbs gently grilled until crisp, will tempt the taste buds. Meat lovers will drool over cauliflower drizzled with olive oil then sprinkled with fried bacon chips or flavoured gourmet sausage and topped with sour cream.

The dressing up of the cauliflower is only limited by your imagination so experiment in the kitchen. The other vegetables in the Brassica family can also be treated with the same dressing and topping enhancements to create interest and flavour on your plate.

Other services available include Social Support, friendly visitors, someone to help you with your shopping or attending appointments and transport services both locally and regionally.





DEMENTIA FRIENDLY MORNING TEA

On Tuesday 7th May the Holbrook Dementia Alliance held our first Morning Tea for the community which was a great success, over 30 people attended with lots of friendly discussion and delicious morning tea, John Cox from the Committee spoke about the Dementia Friendly Café idea. We formed the Dementia Friendly Alliance consisting of John Cox, Sue Winnett, Libby Keogh, Mary-Anne Grunow and Irene Lister, from interested people last year.

In October last year we held a workshop with Dementia Australia to test the need for a Dementia Friendly Community here in Holbrook. To start us off we decided to hold a Dementia Café, hoping to create a conversation and awareness in our community and eventually the Hume Shire area.

Dementia in its many forms is not selective, it does not recognise how rich or poor we are, it does not recognise where we came from or where we live, it does not recognise what job we did in a former life or how we lived that life, it is totally arbitrary, totally random.

So, with those thoughts in mind, our aim in holding these coffee get-togethers is for people who are directly affected by dementia, both carers and those suffering dementia, to come together and feel that they are with fellow travellers and their journey is

being understood by those around them. Many people do find it difficult to talk about dementia, so we hope that these regular get-togethers are a place where-people can feel comfortable talking.

We've had great feedback from the first morning tea as it was enjoyable and informative, and opportunity to relax for a short time, and exchange information and experiences over a cup of tea or coffee and something to eat in a supportive and friendly environment, which is the aim of a Dementia friendly community!

How often we hold these cafes depends on the needs of those participating, therefore we will aim to hold them monthly.

There is no obligation so, if you want to come whenever it suits, please do so or if you have other ideas please share them with us, so we can continue this fun, friendship and support in our Dementia friendly Community. 'To create a more inclusive, supportive and welcoming place where everyone can thrive.' Down the track, we hope to have information days to learn more about what we face and how we can help each other. The next meeting will be held at the Holbrook Sporting Complex on the Thursday, 6 June 2024, starting 10am - 11.30.


FOOTBALL
