Viv touched the lives of so many families in Holbrook. We are all so much better for having had Viv in our lives. Words such as kind, generous, inspirational, young at heart, strong, amazing, vibrant and а leader have all been used to describe her. Viv's teaching



journey began at Pymble Public School, where she taught for three years. She then transitioned to Holbrook Central School 1966. Just recently Viv recounted the tale of taking the train from Sydney to Culcairn, and then the freight train from Culcairn to Holbrook. She took lodgings at the pub, however that was frowned upon, and Viv soon found more suitable accommodations.

Viv's posting turned out to be quite significant, as this is where she met Peter Taylor whom she would marry in 1968 and settle at "Oak Hill" near Cookardinia. Together, they managed the family farm and had two children Nick & Alisa. Viv engaged in casual teaching opportunities across the district while raising her family.

Her teaching took her to the Holbrook Preschool originally held at the Anglican Hall. Viv was involved in the Pre-school for over 30 years, serving as both teacher and director. She was involved in the building of the new Pre-School in Swift Street in 1976 and later the addition of the Childcare Centre. Viv retired from the Pre-school in 2004 and started teaching TAFE at Wagga and later at Albury Tafe.

Viv's impact extended far beyond the classroom, as she forged wonderful friendships within the

communities of Culcairn and Holbrook. Her boundless community spirit endeared her to many, and her involvement in various committees solidified these connections

Eventually, the pace slowed as Peter and Viv retired and settled in Albury 2006. Peter passed away suddenly in April 2011. Viv filled her life with family, friends, travel, community volunteering, coffee, choir & book club.

One of Viv's passions was swimming which was evident from a young age, earning her several championship titles and a collection of impressive silverware. Remarkably, Viv's love for swimming continued until the end of 2023.

Viv embraced her role as mother and grandmother. She was a cherished sister, mum, grandmother, aunt, great aunt, sister in-law, mother-in-law, friend, teacher, and mentor. It was an extraordinary life, she was someone who made the world a brighter place. Rest in Peace

HOLBROOK LANDCARE

New research from CSU's Gulbali Institute has found that wombat burrows can act as a refuge for native wildlife during and after bushfires, offering shelter, food, and water.

While wombats may not actively herd other animals into their burrows, as some social media stories suggested during the Black Summer bushfires, the study confirmed that many native species utilise these burrows.



Researchers examined wombat burrows in Woomargama National Park and Woomargama State Forest, where a large bushfire occurred in 2019-20. They found that native animals like bush rats, agile antechinus, lace monitors, and painted button-quails were more prevalent around burrows compared to areas without them.

The study suggests that wombats, by altering the soil and vegetation around their burrows, create better foraging opportunities for smaller animals, which in turn attracts larger predators.

Wombat burrows may also offer refuge from predators and harsh conditions, with several instances of burrows filling with water and providing a drinking source for other animals.

"The value of wombat burrows as shelter and refuge for numerous species will only increase as fires become more intense in the future," said lead author Grant Linley. He emphasized the importance of protecting wombats, as they are the only native species capable of digging these complex, deep burrows.

This research is being conducted by Professor Dale Nemo and Charles Sturt PhD candidate Grant Linley, and adds to a growing body of evidence highlighting the ecological significance of wombat burrows for a variety of native wildlife.

PLANT PICK PLATE

I have been given some Jerusalem Artichoke tubers to taste and not having eaten them before, I am enthusiastic to seek out their growing conditions, nutritional values and recipes. However, I discovered more information on Globe Artichokes. These plants are not related but both are rich in antioxidants, magnesium, folate and potassium all essential for healthy heart and digestion functions. However, this is where the similarity ends.

The Jerusalem Artichoke is a hardy perennial with bright yellow flowers similar to sunflowers. This root vegetable is exceptionally easy to grow with each plant producing a large number of knobby tubers which can be left in the ground until required. Like potatoes, the tubers are used for the next crop. The plant can reach a height of 3 mt, hence it is advised to cut the growth back to 1.5 mt prior to flowering so as not to overshadow other plants in the garden. Known to cause flatulence after eating large quantities, the tubers have a nutty flavour and can be eaten raw grated in a salad, roasted and added to soups and stews. The Globe Artichoke is a tall thistle like plant up to 1 mt that requires a sheltered position with young plants harvested from offsets. A mature plant can produce a dozen or more large green or purple flowerheads and it is these immature flowerheads that are eaten. The Artichoke heart is cocooned by soft fleshy leaves with the whole head and a short stem edible. Apply lemon juice to all cut areas to avoid oxidation prior to cooking whether it be boiled or fried. When stuffing with herbed breadcrumbs and Parmesan or even an egg, peel off outer leaves and cut 1/3 off the heart to hollow out the centre.

The Holbrook team was coached by Brian Prior and was made up mainly of local players. Some of the younger team members had progressed through the Holbrook juniors.

On Saturday 18 May the Holbrook Football Club hosted a 60-year reunion for a large group of the

players. Players and their wives enjoyed a delicious meal and lots of chats, while watching Holbrook notch up two great wins in the footy against Lockhart. They all appreciated the marvellous hospitality of the Holbrook Footy Club and extended their thanks to the Committee and the ladies who organised the meal.

Holbrook is a proud footy club with a proud history. This was highlighted when Doug Priest, a member of the 1964 Grand Final side, was recently inducted into the NSW AFL Hall of Fame, along with Bertie Haynes, who in 1970, played in Holbrook's only other Farrer League Grand Final win. Both players had come through from the Holbrook juniors.

HOLBROOK SENIORS FOOTBALL

Rd 6: In an entertaining contest, our seniors prevailed by 32 points against a determined Lockhart. The win was built on the back of a great defensive effort in the second half, where our back six only let the Demons post two goals. Earlier, the Brookers had trouble dealing with the visitors' runand-carry tactics, and at half-time it was Lockhart leading by 4 points. However, the match was turned on its head in the third term when Holbrook piled on 5 goals 2 points, while keeping the Demons scoreless. MOTOCROSS RIDE DAY

Sunday 26th May, Holbrook Motorcycle Sports Club held a sellout Ride Park Day at the Wangoola MX track. A Ride Park Day is a non-competitive day aimed at the whole family where riders would go out on the track with other riders of matched ability. Also, at "Wangoola" is a separate Nippers (4yrs old and up, on 50cc or mini bikes) track just aimed at beginners.

On Saturday, President Mark, and club volunteers, watered the track well to keep the dust at bay. Liddell's Lolliland provided

sweets for the sweet tooth and the Liddells were kept busy with 90 riders and their families and supporters.


