### BALD ARCHY MAKES ITS DEBUT AT HOLBROOK

For the very first time Holbrook will hold its of the Opposition Peter official opening of the Bald Archy Prize at the Dutton Shire Hall on Saturday 29th June 24, 6.00pm to 8.00pm

As the Archibald Prize draws attention at the NSW Art Gallery in Sydney, its antithesis, the Bald Archy, Australia's most popular and satirical portrait award will be held in the country town of Holbrook in Greater Hume Shire near the NSW-Victorian border.

Judged by Professor Maude Cockatoo, the world's only avian critic, it celebrates the lighter side of art and the larrikin Australian spirit: portraits that will make you think, talk, and laugh.

Winning subjects in the past have included Kerry Packer, Shane Warne, John Howard, Pauline Hanson and a myriad of other Australian icons.

Local organizers - the Rotary Club of Holbrook sent representatives to Canberra to the official opening of the exhibition. Rotarians Bruce Quick, Milt and Jenny Golenberg, Jen Parer and Jenny Kane were there for the announcement of this year's winner. The award went to Newcastle artist Judy Nadin for her work Flippin' Kerfection, a caricature of Australian professional soccer player Sam Kerr OAM's iconic, celebratory backflip.



#### **HOLBROOK LANDCARE**

Did you see us soil testing along the Hume Hwy a couple of weeks ago?

HLN staff traded the paddocks and demonstration sites for a couple days of soil testing in some rather unfamiliar terrain — the edge of the Hume Highway in Albury. Engaged to investigate some unsuccessful revegetation sites, we put our expertise and equipment to the test.

Our task was to assess soil conditions that

could be hindering plant growth. We used our trusty penetrometer to measure soil compaction sown to a depth of 1.5 m, and collected numerous soil cores, carefully extracting samples for laboratory analysis. These samples will undergo rigorous testing to determine nutrient levels, pH, and other factors that could be affecting the revegetation efforts.

This project presents a unique opportunity for HLN to apply our knowledge and skills in a new environment, contributing to the understanding of how to successfully revegetate areas along busy transportation corridors.

Can you help us find Bogong moths in their winter breeding grounds outside of the Alps? We have been approached by some researchers looking to eDNA sample area that they think may be breeding areas for Bogong Moths. Bogong moths are an ecologically and culturally important species. They undertake a unique migration from the plains of south-east Australia to the alps where they are an essential food source for species like the critically endangered mountain pygmy-possum.

Have you seen a Bogong Moth this year? (Peter caught one back in December). Have you got cutworms? Or cutworm damage on your crop or pastures? It is pretty astonishing that we still don't

know much about the breeding of this iconic species. Get in touch with Kylie or Peter if you think you can help out.



The museum is working on updating its displays and we thank those who were able to come along and help at our last working bee. We held our June meeting last Tuesday and we look forward to catching up with our new museum advisor this week.

#### **ROTARY SAFE FAMILIES**

### 1. <u>R</u>ECOGNISE the signs of abuse

Are you a "bystander"? It can be really worrying when someone you care about is



being hurt or abused by their partner. This guide will help you to become an "active bystander" in supporting female and male victims of abuse. Throughout the guide we refer to the victim as 'she' for simplicity and because the majority of victims are women. However, we encourage supporters of men who are being abused to use this guide and apply the Rotary SAFE Families "3RRR's" of primary prevention of abuse.

2. RAISE Your Concerns "Safely" with victim: Should I get involved? Many people worry that they will be 'interfering' if they get involved, or that it is a 'private matter'. But it is equally worrying if someone is being abused and you say nothing. Your support can make a difference. You might risk some embarrassment if you approach her and she rejects your support or tells you your suspicions are wrong.

But if you approach her sensitively, without being critical, most people will appreciate an expression of concern for their well-being, even if they are not ready to talk about their situation. It is unlikely you will make things 'worse' by expressing concern.

**3.** <u>REFER to professional support or make the call yourself!</u> To increase her safety, whether she is staying in the relationship or has separated, it is important to think about how she can be protected from further abuse.

You could:

- Help her to plan where she and her children could go in an emergency, or if she decides to leave. If she needs to stay at a secret location, tell her about safe accommodation services (refuges). She can ring the Women's Domestic Violence Crisis Service to find out about refuges in New South Wales
- Agree on a code word or signal that she can use to let you know she needs help. (See the item on "Hand Signals" in Rotary SAFE Families website/Latest News)


What can I do if I witness or overhear physical violence or threats?

If you believe there is immediate physical danger

and that she and her children are about to be harmed, call the police on **000** immediately.

If you do have the opportunity to talk to her at another time, ask about whether or not she would like you to call the police. She may fear that calling the police may make things worse for her. Many people are afraid of involving the police, especially those from non-English speaking backgrounds or indigenous communities who may have had bad past experiences. You could call a domestic violence service to find out about how you could help in this situation.

But remember, when you think there is immediate physical danger, call the police on 000.



It involves a simple two-step movement of placing their palm forward with their thumb tucked in before "trapping" their thumb under their four fingers.

### HONEY MUSTARD CHICKEN SAUSAGE ROLLS

2 x 500g packets chicken (or pork) sausages

2 tbsp honey

1 tbsp

wholegrain

mustard

2 tsp Dijon mustard

25g (¼cup) dried breadcrumbs

2 tsp fresh thyme leaves

S sheets frozen puff pastry, just

thawed

1 egg, lightly whisked

- Preheat oven to 220C/200C fan forced.
- Line 2 baking trays with baking paper.
- Remove the sausage meat from the casings. Place the sausage meat in a bowl.
- Add the honey, wholegrain & Dijon mustards, thyme and breadcrumbs. Mix until well combined.
- Cut the pastry sheets in half. Arrange one-sixth of the chicken mixture lengthways down the centre of each pastry piece. Brush 1 long edge of pastry with a little egg. Fold pastry over the filling, pressing to seal and form a roll. Cut each roll into 5 even pieces. Place pieces, seam-side down, on prepared trays.
- Bake for 25-30 minutes or until golden and cooked through. Serve sausage rolls hot.

The sale will run for 4 days from Friday 19<sup>th</sup> July until Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> July. Online clearing sales have exploded in popularity since COVID and they are achieving outstanding results for vendors. The benefits of the online auction mean that your items stay on your farm until they are sold, and your payment is received. You do not have to ship them to an auction site and delivery is arranged by the purchaser. You also set your own start price & reserve. Purchasers can bid from their home and the Auction catalogue will be seen by all people who use the AuctionsPlus system Australia wide. The sale will also be advertised in the Holbrook, Albury-Wodonga & Wagga areas as well as promoted on social media and emailed out to a large database.

The Football Club will handle all invoicing and payments and the items will not leave your property until cleared payment has been made.




