OPENING OF BALD ARCHY EXHIBITION IN HOLBROOK

Saturday June 29th saw the gala opening of the Bald Archy exhibition at the Holbrook Shire Hall.

The grand centre old building hosted 85 guests who came to celebrate art, culture and the Australian larrikin spirit. 42 paintings of the notable, famous, popular, unpopular and one ignoble person, are currently on display at the Shire Hall until Sunday July 28th

The exhibition was officially opened by member for Albury, Mr Justin Clancy, along with the Shire Mayor, Tony Quinn. Unfortunately our local member, Susan Ley was unable to attend, but was there in caricature, along with her boss, Peter Dutton. Susan did pop in for a viewing the next day, on her way to Canberra, and was suitably impressed.



The Bald Archy exhibition has seen many hundreds of travellers take a diversion off the Hume Highway, to visit Holbrook, take in the art, and amble along Albury Street, visiting various traders. The overall impression from business owners that I have spoken to, is that they are happy to have the extra customers, and the Bald Archies has contributed positively to their trade over the past 2 weeks. The Rotary Club of Holbrook applied for the Bald Archy exhibition, and were successful in securing the rights up to and including the 2026 exhibition.

Many volunteers from the Woolpack inn, the Holbrook Art Group, Lions Club and individuals, have made their time available to work on the door to meet and greet visitors. Holbrook's art group including Rhiannon Hall, Gabriella Brehm, Wendy Swan, Yvonne Keogh and Jo Gammage worked on the hall set-up and created the dimensional image of Professor Maude Cockatoo.

The Bald Archy prize exhibition has been welcomed by Rotary's new president Belinda Izzard who said, "people have come from far and wide to see it – even from across the Tasman."

"It has been very well received, visitors have admired the way the exhibition has been set up in the spacious shire hall with excellent lighting, and warmth."

Plans to host the Bald Archy started last year – local Rotarians wanted a project to bring the fine art of satire and fun to the town and shire, to entertain the community, and assist volunteer organisations, retail traders and businesses. The Bald Archy project was assisted by a successful \$5,000 funding grant from Murray Arts, and by Greater Hume Council for the use of the shire hall. We look forward to 2 more successful weeks of art and irreverence, before the exhibition moves on. If you haven't been to the Shire Hall, don't miss out. Admission Fees - Adults \$10, children free.

St Stephens Uniting Church in Wodonga made the move to livestreaming and recording when the Covid became the big issue of 2019.

The amateur technical personnel in the congregation managed to set up the necessary equipment and eventually, with some expert help, were able to establish a private YouTube link to the services, that could be accessed by anyone wishing to participate in the worship services each Sunday. This also allowed smaller congregations without a full or even a part time minister, to gather in their church or hall, or even a home, to tune in on-line and be "at church" along with the Wodonga congregation. Given the circumstances in Holbrook with the closure of Knox Uniting Church, St Stephens would like to help by making its services on Sundays, available to more people at any time.

The service cannot be accessed without the link, and is a different link each time, and will be forwarded to you via your email address every week. To be on the mailing list send a note requesting same to

Your email address is NOT passed on to any third party. You will NOT be asked to subscribe or donate. It would be hoped that the service would complement that which is currently available in Holbrook and is absolutely free.

22 June Rd 10 vs RWW Giants

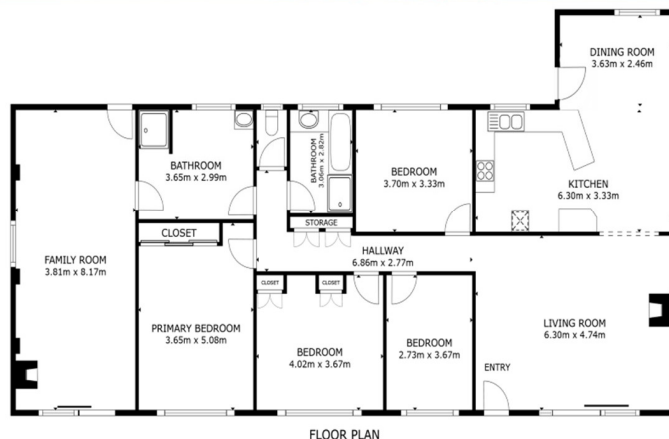
