generous donations.


All donated food items must be non-perishable, while gifts should be donated unwrapped and suitable for children up to the age of 16.

HOLBROOK LANDCARE

Silver Medal for Local "Insect of the Year" Nomination: A cute, vividly coloured native bee with a very distinctive buzz is the ABC's first Australian Insect of the Year.

A total of 13,593 people voted in the inaugural ABC Insect of the Year poll. Just over 50.1% (6,815 votes) chose the blue-banded bee (*Amegilla cingulata*) from a field of six insect finalists selected by an expert panel.

HLN's Peter Rowland was delighted to be asked by Gavin McGrath (ABC Ballarat) to nominate an insect for this competition. Sadly, Gavin had already asked botanist and beekeeper Dr Anna Carrucan to nominate an insect species, and he knew that she would pick the Blue-banded Bee. So he had to think of something that might give it a run for its money.

After much deliberation, Peter nominated the Common Hoverfly (*Melangyna viridiceps*), one of

our region's most prolific pollinators and a species that he thought people would be familiar with. It can also hover! (which is pretty cool). Peter was delighted when Gav rang to



tell him that it received the second highest number of votes with just under 13% of all responses - an honourable silver medal.

The remaining insect nominations for the event were: the Bogong Moth (*Agrotis infusa*), the Golden Stag Beetle (*Lamprima aurata*), the Lord Howe Island Stick Insect (*Dryococelus australis*), and the Eltham copper butterfly (*Paralucia pyrodiscus lucida*).

Get your plant orders in now! It seems a bit doom and gloom at present weatherwise, but if you are planning to do any revegetation for next year, now is the time to order. The world next Autumn may look very different.

Ordering now allows the nurseries to plan to get you exactly what species and how many you need. You can order later, but you will be more constrained as to what they are able to supply.

So get on the front foot – the new "Southwest Slopes Revegetation Guide" is up online at www.revegetation.org.au.

Click on the map to find your profile area, and then what part of the landscape you are in (e.g. creek, hillslope) to get the recommended species for revegetation.

WHITE CHOCOLATE TRUFFLES **Ingredients:**

2 cups white chocolate chips

¼ cup heavy cream or condensed milk

1 teaspoon Vanilla extract

Toppings/Decoration:

2 cups white chocolate, melted

1 cup toppings (chopped nuts, sprinkles, shredded coconut, etc.)

Method:

In a microwave-safe bowl, add white chocolate, cream or condensed milk & vanilla extract. Heat in microwave at 30 sec increments until melted, mixing at each interval to prevent the chocolate burning.

Cover the bowl in Clingwrap & refrigerate for 2-3 hrs, or until the mixture is firm enough to handle. Scoop out small portions of the mixture and shape into balls.

Dip the balls into white chocolate and toss in toppings, if desired.

Place on a lined biscuit tray until set.

Drizzle more melted chocolate over the truffles after the chocolate.


ST PATRICK'S SCHOOL
