HOLBROOK LANDCARE

Farm Water Audit Recordings and Resources: Over the last few weeks Jess has been busy delivering our Farm Water Audit Lunch Litre series and this week we wrapped up the last of our webinars capping it off with estimating losses in farm dams and calculating how long water will last.

This final webinar demonstrates how we bring together our understanding of our farm's water requirements during dry periods and what our most reliable water sources and storages are to ultimately how long water will last in our system under those conditions. We've said it before and we will say it again... Conducting your farm water audit can take as much, or less of your time as you want it to but it is an incredibly valuable resource to give you a whole farm perspective of your farm water situation. In this week's session Jess introduced a Farm Water Management Plan. A document which allows you to incorporate your drought strategy with your farm water audit and efficiently analyse the strengths, weaknesses and opportunities for your farm's water situation. Folks who have been following along with our

example scenario during our webinar series would know that through this process we were able to recognise that 1 of our 3



most reliable dams during the summer period was lost in the system due to evaporation and seepage losses alone, and ultimately we would only have 14 days of water for summer. While that's a hard pill to swallow, it can be a harsh reality in many practical circumstances.

The positive is that knowing your drought strategy, whether you will sell, feed or agist, what your farm's water requirements are for summer, knowing your available water storage, actual volume and conducting an audit is a proactive step you can take and then utilise to prioritise your investment for increasing water security onfarm.

PLANT PICK PLATE

Gardeners are increasingly seeking a low cost, low maintenance garden



which can be achieved by planting easy care plants and a great deal of patience as the garden grows and develops. There is no room for a "must have now" thinking in this gardening project. To start with define the planting areas then the grassed, paved or gravel regions of the garden can be established later.

One of the must have plants are annual self-seeders that provide flowering colour then drop their seeds for next years growth. These include the magnificent displays of the orange Nasturtium, the Poppy in vibrant red, orange, pink, white or mauve cupped flowers, the delicate blooms of the Japanese Windflower and the smaller, but equally brilliant blue or white Cornflower.

Another, are plants with strappy leaves and clumping perennials which multiply in no time at all giving structure to the garden. Dietes with its tall Iris like flowers, the New Zealand Flax and the burgundy coloured leaves of the Cordyline together with Agapanthus are great backdrops. When paired with African Daisies, Gazanias, Brachycome, Marygolds or any of the daisy family in the foreground, that garden bed is complete.

Then there are always the ground covers to consider that meander through the garden. Succulents are a great choice due to their low water requirements and an array of coloured foliage. Chalksticks, Pigface, Lambs ear and Mesembryanthemum will creep gently to fill spaces and complement the fragrant Lavender and Rosemary Jew or Bugle as ground covers which are best suited to large gardens.

If you look around, you will be able to beg, steal or borrow seeds, clumps and cuttings from fellow gardeners for an immediate and low cost start to your garden. **Passionate Gardener**, **June**.

The modern words "garden" and "yard" are descendants of the Old English "geard", which denotes a fence or enclosure. After the emergence of the first civilizations, wealthy citizens began creating gardens for purely aesthetic purposes.

"BATTLE OF THE BORDER" HORSE & CARRIAGE EVENT

3 Phase Combine Driving Event, 3 Days of action-packed excitement, one of the most spectacular, adrenaline-fuelled equestrian sports. Everyone is welcome come join us, FREE ENTRY and camping for spectators at the BATTLE OF THE BORDER.

With 82 entries, competitors and their horses are making the journey from WA, SA, Tasmania, VIC, NSW, QLD to compete along with an international carriage driver from the Netherlands. At the higher levels they will be battling it out for the prestigious "Prince Philip, His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh Perpetual Memorial Trophy", for other competitors there are the Dominiak & Carbery Carriages Trophy and the top Teams Trophy.

The event was designed to be the carriage driving equivalent of ridden eventing except that the horses are pulling a carriage and being driven by a competitor. It involves 3 phases, the first phase, the Dressage, is performed in an enclosed arena of 100m x 40m. The drivers complete a set of movements in that arena and are judged on their accuracy, the horse's obedience and willingness and their presentation.

Phase 2, Cones, follows the dressage. This is where the horses are driven through multiple of pairs of cones which have a ball placed top of each cone. The cones are set only cms wider than the carriage wheels so that drivers must drive accurately but also must drive quick enough not to incur time penalties.





Penalties are also given if balls are knocked from the cones.

The third phase, Marathon, is held on Sunday. This is driven over several kilometres whilst drivers have to manoeuvre and negotiate obstacles on course, with their horses or ponies. These obstacles are placed in a row and all spectators will see the whole event from just one location whilst sitting under the shade of some beautiful big old Elm trees.

In addition, do your Christmas shopping at the same time by visiting the Battle Of The Border Marketplace, open over the three days. Feeling hungry, we offer food vendors selling delicious comfort food. Bring the whole family, sit under the huge trees and enjoy the spectacular, non-stop action, something everyone will enjoy. Bring a chair, your hat and sunscreen. See you here!!!


and saw the factory in operation! lt was really fun! Ben—I really liked going to **Parliament** House. It was good because we saw what we learned in class in person. The Parliamentary
