PLANT PICK PLATE

A hedge or no hedge? This is a question that requires very careful consideration landscaping a new garden or redeveloping an existent one. Do you want to add to the garden duties of weekly mowing the lawn and also regularly trimming that hedge? Do you have the skills and equipment required to trim straight and even to create a hedge master piece? Do you realise that this is time that is eating into other essential activities, such as fishing. A point well made by my garden helper so our vigorous growing front hedge was cut down. He wasted no time is firing up the chainsaw when I agreed. I must admit it was ugly, a mixture of old plants, Nandina, Crab-apple, Japonica and Variegated Privet that once trimmed, sprouted again the minute your back was turned.



The low Buxus hedge lining the driveway is much less robust, however it has been neglected somewhat, so out came the hedge trimmer and my garden helper attacked that with vigour, while keeping it at an acceptable height. I eyed up the many tubs full of trimmings, cuttings I thought. Several handfuls I placed in water for striking later. I envisaged a low and slow growing, lush green Buxus hedge along our front fence to provide a neat boundary and to complement its cousins down the driveway. "NO, not another hedge" I heard him say as he reached for his fishing line.

Well, I certainly do not want to trim another hedge so I can see his point. What was I thinking? Maybe a row of long strappy leafed plants that are attractive but also low maintenance would provide more amenable option.

We are having a bush picnic so do not forget to bring morning tea, lunch, and anything you may need like your picnic rug, chairs, folding table, and drinks.


These days are a great introduction to four-wheel driving with the security of others along with you.



I've also thoroughly enjoyed working on the Southern New South Wales Birds on Farms project with the wonderful team at BirdLife Australia, and the dedicated Refreshing River Management team. These projects (along with the Landcare Led Resilience project) gave me the chance to meet so many amazing farmers who are so passionately working to preserve and increase the biodiversity and natural resilience on their properties – something I'll always remember with great fondness.


