ROTARY'S 40 YEARS IN HOLBROOK

Holbrook Rotarians had a party to celebrate the 40th Anniversary of their charter in August 1985 at a dinner held at the Returned Services Club on Thursday 21st August 2025.

President Craig Rowe welcomed 9790 District Governor Emma Davis, Rotarians from Albury, Albury Hume, Bellbridge Lake Hume, and Wodonga West, visiting charter members Henry Parker, Bill Parker and Daryl Christensen and partners, friends of Rotary from Holbrook Lions, the Wool Pack Inn Museum, the schools, Holbrook Triathlon, group study exchange alumni, retired members, and Paul Harris Fellows honoured in the community.

Jen Parer, in charge of researching the Charter, pulled out some early history including the first meeting of a Provisional Rotary Club for Holbrook which took placed at the Byer Flag Motor Inn on 25th March 1985. Past District Governor Eric Kronborg was elected charter president, the secretary was Mike Blayney and treasurer Don Lloyd. The club was officially chartered on 19 August 1985, and a few weeks later nearly 300 people including Rotarians from all over NSW and Victoria attended a charter event at the Holbrook Shire Hall.

The St Pat's catering committee came to the fore, Dell Emerson quoted and for the princely sum of \$7 a head provided entrée, main course (alternate chicken and beef with veg) and dessert (fruit salad, apple pie and cream), tea and coffee and for an extra 50c provided bread rolls and butter, 20c for sherry and 50c for wine. It ended up about \$11.60 a head which covered the cost of the hall.

Most impressive was that 64 people came from the Rotary Club of Albury, the sponsoring club that made 84 trips out to Holbrook in the lead up to the charter to encourage members to join and educate them in the ways of Rotary.

Charter member John Cox was one of 22 members of the club back in 1987 and recalled some rules, such as only one profession was allowed to be represented in the club. This limiting rule did not daunt the local farmers. "Our occupations ranged from fat lamb production, thin lamb production, grass fed beef farmer, hay fed beef farmer, lot feed cattle, grass growing farmer."

"How things have changed – Rotary was formal, attendance vev strict, more than three or four

weeks missed meant permission from the board was needed, dress was neat/casual, most members wore ties, guest speakers were allotted 20 minutes and meetings finished on the dot of 8.30pm."

"Over the years Rotary has made an impression on Holbrook and most rewarding of all, the youth of this town. Through youth exchange, Outward Bound, supporting our local schools, RYLA, RYPEN and more recently supporting our youth to sail on the tall ships.

"Who will forget the two Johnson girls Kirby and Lexy who blew us away with their reports on their Science Week in Canberra and subsequent travels abroad."

A special presentation on the night by president Craig and Jen Parer, was the conferring of the Paul Harris Fellow to the Holbrook Happenings team represented by Rita Bowler. Carried out mainly by volunteers, Holbrook's free prints over 1,000 copies each fortnight and is the ears and eyes of the community, keeping us connected and communicating.

Rotary was started by Paul Harris in 1905 as a fellowship club for professionals who were new to town. It was a way of getting to know like minded businessmen. It has since grown into a word wide organisation and right up to today, is an opportunity to meet fellow community members.

Craig Rowe followed up on these comments emphasising that while we look to the future tasked with the continuation of the Rotary Club of Holbrook we need to keep in mind the vital role friendship and fellowship play in our service activities.

BRONWYN'S RAYGUN IN BALD ARCHY

There was great excitement when the Rotary Club of Holbrook staging the Bald Archy discovered an artist living in Holbrook has won a place in the irreverent portrait prize judged by Professor Maude Cockatoo. Bronwyn Berg's comedic interpretation of the Aussie Olympian Raygun titled 'Skip to the Louvre' is a lot of fun. A realistic depiction of the Raygun many Australians laughed at during her break-dancing performance at the Paris Olympics, lampooned for her lack of athleticism, clapped her wacky interpretation and guts to perform, and later had a musical created which was banned from performing. Looking on the bright side, "Raygun's kangaroo pose has gone beyond the Paris Olympic experience and has become a symbol of Australian recognition," Bronwyn said. Despite the criticism, there's a lot of cheeky symbolism in the artist's playful, tongue-incheek image - "her tongue is cheerfulness, toilet paper is tangled in controversy, her kangaroo pose recognises something Aussie, seen through the lens of a media circus (the clown), and King Charles (the Olympic Federation who perhaps slept through it all)."

Holbrook has been home for Bronwyn for the past 5 years and she has spent 10 years all up in the Riverina. "Art has always been in my blood," she said.

As an artist she was influenced by her father who painted, is self-taught and has loved drawing since early primary school. Many school friends would ask her to do their drawings; she has an uncanny knack of creating a true likeness in her images. And she has done some tertiary studies in graphics and fine arts.

While living on Norfolk Island, Bronwyn was invited to design stamps with images of participating writers at a Writers Festival Stamp Issue. The writers included Colleen McCullough, R.G. Tofts, Alice Buffet, Peter Clarke, Maeve and Gil Hitch, and Archie Bigg. She dramatically arrived in a postal bag with printed stamps of the authors she had designed, ready to distribute. What an honour and achievement!

Today, Bronwyn is inspired by the Impressionists, a favourite artist is Van Gogh, likes to try out semi abstract styles, enjoys listening to people's stories, has joined the Knox art group, and recent works include illustrative pencil and ink abstracts.

Bronwyn discovered the Bald Archy exhibition that exudes wit, satire and scandal, when it arrived in Holbrook in 2024. "I love satire and have already started thinking about what I will create for the 2026 Bald Archy," she said.

SOUTHERN NSW MAYORS TAKE DROUGHT FIGHT TO STATE AND FEDERAL LEADERS

The Mayors of Greater Hume and Snowy Valleys Councils will take their fight for urgent drought support directly to State and Federal Agriculture Ministers, Shadow Ministers, and key regional leaders following growing concern over worsening conditions across Southern NSW.

This advocacy follows the highly attended Southern NSW Drought Summit, held on 4 August 2025, which brought together 474 participants, including farmers, agribusinesses, mental health professionals, community leaders, and seven Members of Parliament. The Summit delivered a clear and united message: communities need immediate, practical support—not more talk. "The message from our Summit was crystal clear," said Cr Lea Parker, Mayor of Greater Hume. "Farmers and communities are exhausted. They don't need more 'resilience programs'—they need direct support to survive this drought: freight and fodder subsidies, emergency grants, debt relief, and recognition of drought as a natural disaster." Cr Julia Ham, Mayor of Snowy Valleys, reinforced the message: "Our farmers are already resilient. They've endured two failed springs and are doing everything they can to hold on. What they need now is not more training or theory—but urgent, practical help."

The Mayors will press for action on key concerns, including:

- 50% of NSW now drought-affected, with 18+ months of rainfall deficits
- The risk of a third failed spring, which could devastate breeding herds, pastures, and community wellbeing
- The growing mental health and financial toll, including two recent farmer suicides in Holbrook
- Funding inequity: Victoria (\$144m) and South Australia (\$73.4m) have committed direct drought support, while NSW farmers remain without equivalent assistance
- Ineffectiveness of current services, with Local Land Services and Drought Hubs seen as offering tokenistic activities, not real support.

The Mayors acknowledged the \$43 million in funding for the Farm Business Resilience Program, jointly announced today by the NSW and Federal Governments at the Bush Summit in Wagga Wagga, but say it misses the mark for farmers in immediate distress. "We're not dismissing the value of long-term planning," said Cr Parker. "But when farmers are choosing between buying feed or paying bills, a resilience workshop in six months' time won't help them today. They've already proved how resilient they are—what they need now is financial relief."

"Farmers don't need business coaching and workshops right now—they need real, on-the-ground support that puts fodder in paddocks, fuel in tractors, and confidence back into our communities."

The Mayors are calling for the immediate establishment of a Government-led, Producer-Informed Drought Taskforce to: • Coordinate drought relief efforts • Oversee recovery programs • Restore confidence among farmers that government is listening and responding

"This is about leadership and accountability," said Cr Parker. "Farmers are working day and night to keep stock alive, spending millions on feed, and watching their communities unravel. It is time for governments to step up. We will keep advocating until they do."
