Glow Well-being Workshop, Sunday 3rd March: HOORAY...we did it!!!

28 bookings made, but 21 attendees on the day took away deeper understandings of identifying what lies within or beyond our control, the physical warning signs of anxiety and stress and ways to counterbalance. Sally's calm manner was contagious, and without being overly scientific, explained the Nervous System States, going from feeling safe and connected, to hyperarousal, going into fight or flight mode, and disconnected and immobilised states.

Handbooks were filled with learnt strategies, regulation tools for everyday life, ways to adapt to various situations, and individual types of Self-Care.

People felt comfortable to safely share experiences and supported by those around them—many finding that they were not alone in what they felt. It was wonderful for us to see people as they left - smiles on their faces, more self-empowered and very grateful to Sally and to Rural Care Link for organising such an event.

It also proved to be a very useful way to convey more information on what Rural Care Link does in the community- Vickie talking with guests informally about our Carers Support Group, Lizzie in her introduction, running through a brief list of our various Core Business areas...(must have been successful as we managed to recruit some terrific new members!)

Jindera War Memorial in need of Restoration

Recently the Jindera Recreational Reserve Management Committee were successful in securing a grant for \$3,000.00 to have the Jindera War Memorial assessed by qualified conservationists, due to its current condition.

With the report now being received and provided to several specialists in memorial restoration, the unanimous response received indicated that the damage to the memorial is extensive. The majority of this damage is due to the age of the War Memorial which was constructed to commemorate the First World War which took place from 1914 to 1918.

Furthermore, the cost and practicality of being able to successfully repair the memorial so it's structurally sound long into the future is simply not achievable.

The Jindera Recreational Reserve Committee are considering investigating the possibility of removing the existing structure, and either rebuilding it to the current specifications or redesigning a new war memorial for our local community.





We embarked on an exciting journey of exploration with chalk. Our time spent experimenting with chalk they were allowed us to develop our fine motor skills, coordination, and descriptive language.



It also allowed us to use the colours of dry chalk together and watch in wonder as the colours transformed before our eyes.

The excitement increased as we added water, creating a beautiful sticky substance we were eager to play with.

Watching the chalk dry as the water evaporated was a fascinating experience that we all enjoyed. The children led



this activity and offered a genuinely inspiring sensory experience.

Keeping Cool



We have been able to use play and connection to 'cool down on hot days!' Initially, we talked about making a shopping list together of fruit we could freeze to cool us down in the hot weather over the previous hot days. We then spent time together in small groups, cutting up the fruit and freezing it.

There was so much STEM in this experience — a sense of temperature, using a force with a knife, halves and quartered fruits, etc. We even had a discussion about the water we used to rinse the knife off, making a 'vortex,' with children

pre-

offering their own knowledge about this.

To be truthful, it was in this conversation that we reflected that children's current understanding of the world should never be underestimated.

The word vortex and the reason for a vortex was eloquently explained by a 4 year old.

It also allowed for a great sense of well-being for children - being equipment brings with it a sense of



allowed to take a safe risk with safe equipment brings with it a sense of confidence and achievement.

It builds a relationship of respect. We also were able to build on resilience - we created this shopping list, which meant some children who helped create the list were not going to be at preschool the next day - and yes, they would miss out tomorrow, but we know that they will have other opportunities at another time.



Exploring Magnets

Humans are born with a natural desire to figure out how things in their world work.

Magnets are a great way for children to explore their world, especially when they are encouraged to move around to examine scientific properties.

Our favourite discovery was finding that the tunnel is magnetic. The children used the magnet tiles to create starry nights, swings and spikes.





We follow the senior clubs' draw throughout the season, which means we get many opportunities to play morning and half-time games against other Hume League Auskick centres.




