This will be followed by a Morning Tea supplied by the Jindera CWA at the **School of Arts Hall**.





With only a couple of weeks remaining in the term, it has certainly been a fun and eventful start to the year. The following is a snapshot of some of the main events from February and March.




Student Representative Council

Earlier in the term, classes voted on and elected representatives to form the 2023 Student Representative Council. 

• Due to the increasing traffic and pedestrian movements in the CBD section of Jindera the current school bus stop in front of the Post Office is being moved to in front of the School of Arts and Village Green. The new bus stop will be ready to use when school commences after the term holidays.

SCHOOL BUS STOP ZONE

- Work on the new playground and toilet block will commence after Easter to be completed by the end of June. As the Swap Meet was on it couldn't start earlier.
- Once again there was an incident at the Village Green with the toilets being trashed. Not a good promotion for the town when there were close to 200 visitors using the Village Green. Some youths were seen sitting outside the Next Level Café at midnight Saturday. Footage from the council cameras on the corner will be looked at when it is downloaded. Council will be installing security cameras within the Village Green. Thanks to the Jindera Service Station for making their facilities available.
- The cake stall and raffle last Saturday to raise funds for up-lights in some of the trees in the Village Green was very successful with \$1500 raised. The raffle will be drawn on April 1st.
- The proposed Telstra colocation on the Optus tower at the Jindera Recreation Reserve is a step closer. The application process with Crown Lands has been completed and stakeholder feedback is being sought. It is unlikely that there will be negative feedback so once this period has ended Crown Lands will provide the licence and building the site can be scheduled.


Stitch and Chat Craft Group

We're excited to say that this year St John's is hosting the ANZAC Day Service at the Jindera Memorial Park.



Fundraising Motorcycle Ride

Jindera Village Green - Sunday 19th March 2023

The Committee for Albury Wodonga Black Dog Ride would like to *Thank* the *Community of Jindera* for their interaction and support of our Annual Fundraising event. Local Business, Residents and Families assisted us to hold a successful Days event.

Black Dog Ride is a National Charity, without the support of Government funding, which promotes Conversations around good mental health, specifically around Depression Awareness and Suicide Prevention, using the spectacle of Motorcycles as a conversation starter.

The Charity has a grant program, allowing Community Organisations to apply for funding to support their own specific local Mental Health Programs.

Across Victoria on Sunday March 19, we held 10 Awareness rides, mobilising over 800 motorcycles, raising significant funds for our programs and holding significant conversations with communities. Across Australia, on the same weekend, 29 rides were facilitated, with more than 3,000 motorcyclists and supporters engaging with Community.

Over 120 people gathered at Jindera Village Green from 7.30am last Sunday, to meet, display and ride their motorcycles in our parade ride.

After enjoying coffee and breakfast food from staff at the Pioneer Museum, with a long line supporting breakfast orders at times, we left Jindera in convoy at 9am, travelling to the communities of Howlong and Corowa, before stopping for refreshments at Caffeine and Machine Café in Rutherglen, where we held a brief Auction to raise funds. 

Mixed results for the fishing in March with **massive fish kills** in the Menindee lakes and adjoining rivers area seeing a sea of dead fish floating, the number of dead fish makes you wonder how you couldn't help but catch a fish a month ago......

Lake Hume still has fish effected by the <u>mystery virus</u> effecting redfin and catches of redfin have generally been pretty ordinary with most decent fish having had the virus, however several local anglers have managed to get good catches of healthy fish from around Bowna and around the Drummonds bay region.

Fishing in the Murray and Murrumbidgee Rivers for Murray cod has been good with most anglers getting some legal sized cod mixed with lots of trout cod and undersized Murray cod. The water colour is strange however the fish are still biting well.

The washup from the recent South West Anglers Comp at Buckingbong was impressive, 59 anglers inc. 9 children and 12 ladies caught 325 fish with 31 anglers catching legal size Murray cod, 42 cod were in the 550 to 650 size range and 3 above that size, 79 trout cod were caught size between 250 up to 550, yellas were all good size 400 up to 500. Winning club was Corowa, best fish was a Murray cod 740.


