Large areas of central and northern NSW are expected to see increased risk of fire in 2023/4. This summer is expected to be hotter and drier than recent years with strong grass growth in many parts of NSW. It is the time to prepare your family and home for the coming bush fire season. Know your risk this bush fire season and prepare well ahead.

- If you live in an area near grasslands or farms, recent rain has caused widespread grass growth.
- As this dries out the risk of grassfires increases.
- Grass fires can start easily and move quickly and farmlands may be at increased risk.
- Most people have thought about what to do during a bush fire, but many plans won't stand up the test of a fire.
- Making a plan and preparing your property can reduce your risk from fire.
- You need to make important decisions before a fire such as where to go, what to take and what to do with animals.

Neighbourhood Safer Places are a *place of last resort* during a bush fire emergency.

They are to be used when all other options in your bush fire survival plan can't be put into action safely.

You should be aware of any Neighbourhood Safer Places in your area and note them in your bush fire survival plan before a bush fire occurs. You should also know how to get there, as well as alternate routes in case the road is blocked or too dangerous to drive on.



PUBLIC HEALTH ALERT THUNDERSTORM ASTHMA

Current high pollen counts and the predicted thunderstorms can increase the risk of asthma.

- If you know you have asthma carry your asthma puffer with you at all times and try to stay indoors with the windows and doors closed during the storm period.
- Be aware that thunderstorm asthma can also affect people who have not had asthma before.
- If you have breathing difficulties call 000 or go to your nearest hospital Emergency Department.

You can monitor thunderstorm activity in your region via the Bureau of Meteorology website www.bom.gov.au.

- The Swimming Season is in full swing. The kiosk is being run by the Swimming Pool Committee and they would appreciate any help that people can give them especially with school holidays coming up.





Our Special Guests were our First Nations Artist, Marlene Plunkett and Wiradjuri Leader/ Cultural Performer, Darren Wrighton.

Our children watched in awe as they witnessed the Welcome to Country delivered by Darren and saw the beautiful sounds of the Didgeridoo.





We learnt some new words and explored the yarning circle with Darren and what it means to "have a yarn" or to "tell stories".

This was a beautiful opportunity to have our learning community come together and thank Marlene and Kelly, who painted our mural, which was the final piece of this space.

This mural reflects the play space that is our First Nations Garden, and this shows how interactive and engaging this space is for our children as they learn respect acknowledgment of our First Nations People.

Waterplay

Now that the weather is warming up. We are currently exploring waterplay within our outdoor play spaces.

STEM and science come into this area; children can measure and fill cups to explore spatial awareness as they pour water backwards and forwards between containers

We have built roads, houses, bridges, and small worlds using all the materials supplied.



Marri and Barru - The Peregrine Falcons Project

We are confident and involved learners Resourced Learning through Live Streamed Technology

Our Kangaroo Group have been engaging in technology and learning through our smartboard and live camera streaming links. The children have connected with the Falcon Project that studies, monitors, and records the breeding and natural behaviour of a resident peregrine falcon family on the Charles Sturt University Orange campus.

Through the live streaming cameras, the children have been observing the behaviours and developments of the peregrine falcons and learning about how they grow, look, feed, sound and move. This experience has allowed them to see the changing features, behaviours, growth, and development of the peregrine falcons as they nest, hatch, and grow in real time. The children and staff have invested in this project and have established a connection through technology with our natural environment.

The Kangaroo Group participated in a naming poll for the young and were lucky to be present during the young falcons first flight. This experience continues to be extended by children and family's interest, new developments, and changing natural elements and physical factors. The Kangaroo group have been tracking the falcon's growth using charts and calendars and learning through enquiry, wonder, observation, investigation, and research.

They have learnt about the effects of the natural elements, human behaviour, and infrastructure impact and the many the skills and challenges young peregrines face as they become independence.



Well!!! Somehow, without what seems a blink of the eye, we are nearly at years end!!! I find it astounding how quickly the year seems to pass by. We hope, as you prepare for this year's end - the school presentation events and concerts, the Christmas parties and the end of year work "do's", that you take some time to reflect on the year that has past and consider your achievements.

At the museum, it has continued to be a jam-packed year. We have commenced the process of the new building, after some long-drawn out episodes with land transfer and now the Development Application process, which all seem to be intent on slowing down our progression forward. But sometimes this is a good thing, it gives us time to reflect and consider and 'get our ducks in order', and this can be helpful. Our **flyer** for how you can assist us with this development is on the next page (page 27).

The museum committee spends time working on the museum exhibits; developing, acquiring, adjusting. It looks at the maintenance issues that plague an old site and determines which need to be dealt with first; and it looks to ways to remain viable; with good business acumen, vision for the future, promotion and market development. And as I reflect on the year that has been, we have had achievements in all of these areas.

The incredible work done to be able to open the whole of the **blacksmith site** in September was brilliant. This is a valuable addition to the museum and one that expands on the town's history. It took a great deal of hard work to get to the opening in September, but that has provided the museum with another excellent exhibition area and a space that can be utilised for other events.

We have continued to acquire new items for the museum collection, in particular this year we have obtained some exceptional historic pieces from the local property, Granite Hill, which had been in the **Schulz family** for over 100 years. The steam driven chaff cutter has been of great interest as many people have commented on knowing of it, working on it, or purchasing chaff made with it. This interesting piece of machinery cut thousands of bags of chaff for horses in the district and provided an additional line of income for the family.

The Schulz family also bred prize winning Clydesdale horses. We now have a collection of shoes made for these phenomenal horses as they were presented at the Melbourne Show. There have been some other lovely pieces of a more personal nature added to the museum collection from the family; the original pram in which the children were promenaded, the children's rocking horse, the family milk separator, and a beautiful collection of embroidery.

Throughout the year we have continued to host many private functions and a collection of our own events with our High Tea's continuing to be our signature events. We also hosted a Bush Dance, a Heritage Dinner, a Long Lunch (see page 28), our Twilight Opening and our largest event, The Forgotten Trades Day, which highlighted an interesting array of characters and trades and attracted our largest numbers to the museum in one day.

We have continued to attract good numbers to our **Tea Rooms** each Sunday and many groups and schools have visited the museum and town throughout the year. We commenced our cinema advertising campaign mid-year and enjoyed the photo-shoot day held as a preliminary event, with assistance from several families in the township.

We will again hold our Christmas Wreath Making Workshops, hosted by local artist Allison Viedt. Three workshops will be held on Sunday 17th December, 9.30am, 11am and 1pm; booking is via Trybooking and

Our President Yvonne Booth OAM welcomed us all including our Greater Hume Councillor Doug Meyer OAM, Deputy Chairman for Riverina Water.

Two new members, Lois Biti and Pam Schulz were presented with their Probus badges. We received reports of last month's happy day with Albury, Hume, Wagga Wagga, Murrumbidgee and Holbrook Probus Clubs and thank you from clubs.

Yvonne has received advise that the Peter Mac fund raising group has raised \$99,163-62 in the past twelve months. We have been a big part of making baby clothes, toys, beautiful bears, hot water bottle covers and heat bags with wheat and lavender . Congratulations to all those helpers, your beautiful work goes towards a very good cause, and thank you to the generous souls who support us by donating yarn, and transport our work to Melbourne.

Yvonne has told us of a Beanie competition being arranged for next June. We are making Beanies for the men of the Seaman's Mission in Sydney, and this is advance notice to everyone to knit for this most worthy cause as part of a competition. There will be more information after Christmas.

Our five minute speaker was See Gain.

See was born in Malaysia. She spoke of her childhood during Japanese occupation. See was the youngest of five children, raised by her mother, while working in the family book shop, after her father had died at enemy hands. See studied nursing in England, and now plays Probus with us and cares for us as she does for her family. Yvonne presented See with a Probus pen as a token of our thank you for a most interesting speech.

At Henty there is now a choir. Intention is to sing for the folks in care and community events. After an attempt by our Probus at the carol, Twelve days of Christmas, with no songbooks, we might need some choral assistance.

After morning tea we had our main speaker, Brenton from Riverina Water. He came with a helper to set up the slide show. Brenton told us of being part of a team of people being sent to Nepal, as volunteers, to Rotary projects in Nepal. The time was over three weeks, and included Virginia the computer lady as part of a team including leaders from Albury. The team ranged in ages from 18 to 80 years . Rotary volunteers became a way to refit a three storey building to be dormitory rooms for nursing students.

In February, Brenton went to Katmandu and saw cremations at the River Ganges and learned that the Gurkhas are from Nepal too. The roads were very windy in Nepal, a country of at least thirty million people on a land area similar to half size of Victoria. The team stayed in a hotel with hot water, wi-fi and air conditioning. Food was spicy with flat bread. Occupational health and safety was not the same as for Australia Language differences required Rotary club translator or lots of hand signals.

Tall white people were a novelty, and in Nepal, high school lasted until age 23 years of age. Projects included giving treadle sewing machines and training to local women and small water units to a maternity hospital. Brenton talked of going to small villages to hand out books and back packs to school children, and making a bedroom for the caretaker of the dormitories by renovating an animal shelter that he had been sharing with the creatures.

Apparently Riverina Water has Vietnamese people here learning about our water systems and will perhaps do an exchange with their people in the future. Brenton was presented with our Probus pen as a thankyou for telling us about a most amazing experience.

Lots of questions were asked and answered, and talk over lunch was that the Probus people were most happy with the visit. Thank you to all involved in arranging this visit.

Our Christmas meeting is to be lunch at Henty on the second Wednesday of the month, 13th December - 11.30am for a 12.00 start. Menu is roast turkey and vegetables with mini pavlovas for dessert. Cost is \$25 and booking must be made with Yvonne Booth or Kevin Fogarty, unless you have already signed to attend.




2023 Christmas Party will be held at the clubhouse in December and will be discussed at the December weigh-in and formalized at the next general meeting.
