
◆ Hueske Road Bus Stop

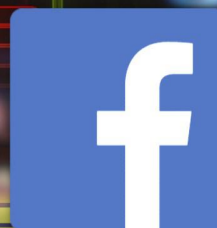

- Have a think about if the NSW RFS is right for you. Where you can, try and attend open days, information sessions and **speak to your local brigade** where current volunteers can help you decide.

JINDERA RURAL FIRE BRIGADE



In the lead up to the 2023-2024 fire season the supporting agencies warned us of a hot, long and dry summer. This usually means high fire danger and more fires. The heavy grass and scrub fuel load in the area dried off toward the end of spring heralding the start of the season with indications of a busy season ahead. Luckily toward the end of spring the rain returned.

This year the sporadic rain has arrived with abundant **lightning strikes**. The lightning has caused numerous trees to catch fire however hasn't delivered enough rain to completely extinguish the fires. Some trees burn out quickly but some trees can take weeks to burn out. Sometimes these trees are so isolated that they smoulder unnoticed for days or weeks at a time. Cured grass however can dry off within hours of the rain stopping so some of the burning trees around the Greater Hume Shire needed to be extinguished and in several cases these trees had to be cut down to enable access to completely extinguish the established fire.

One example of this is a **call out** that we received on **Christmas day**. On average the Jindera brigade receives a call out around 1 in 5 Christmases. As luck would have it, we have been called out two Christmas days in a row. Our volunteers are on standby and available 24 hours per day 7 days per week indefinitely.

The call out this Christmas day was to help Burrumbuttock Brigade extinguish a tree that had been struck by lightning and was fully engulfed despite the fact that it was also raining quite heavily. It took hours to cut up and completely extinguish the fire and the rain only stopped after we had finished the task.

We have had **several small fires** in the **Jindera area** over the summer so we will see what February and March has in store for us.

Maintenance of the brigade equipment is ongoing. An example of this is that the pump on one of our tankers failed in late December. Our volunteers got to work on it and had it back up and running again in early January.

Enjoy the rest of summer, stay safe and remain fire ready.

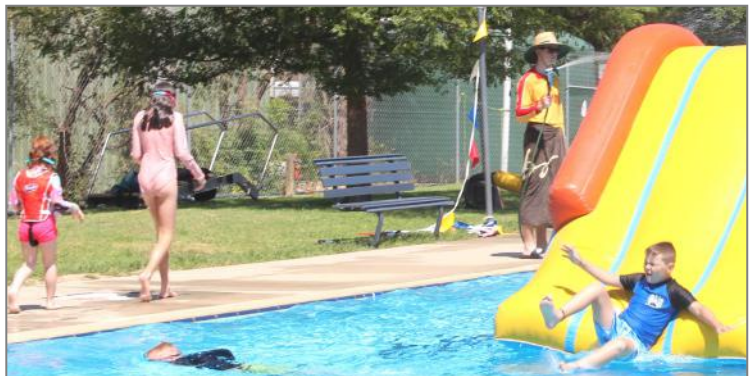

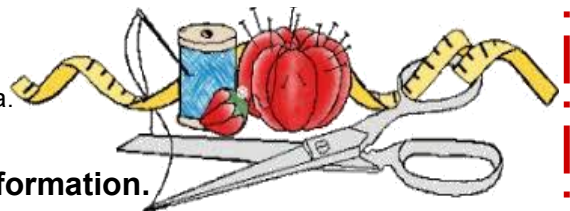

We have followed up during January with the first of our **Twilight Opening evenings**, a tribute to the beautiful evenings we have in summer. This was no exception with

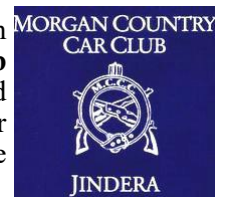


a delightful evening of music from our **local musicians, White Line**, and an easy evening of food and beverage presented by our volunteers.

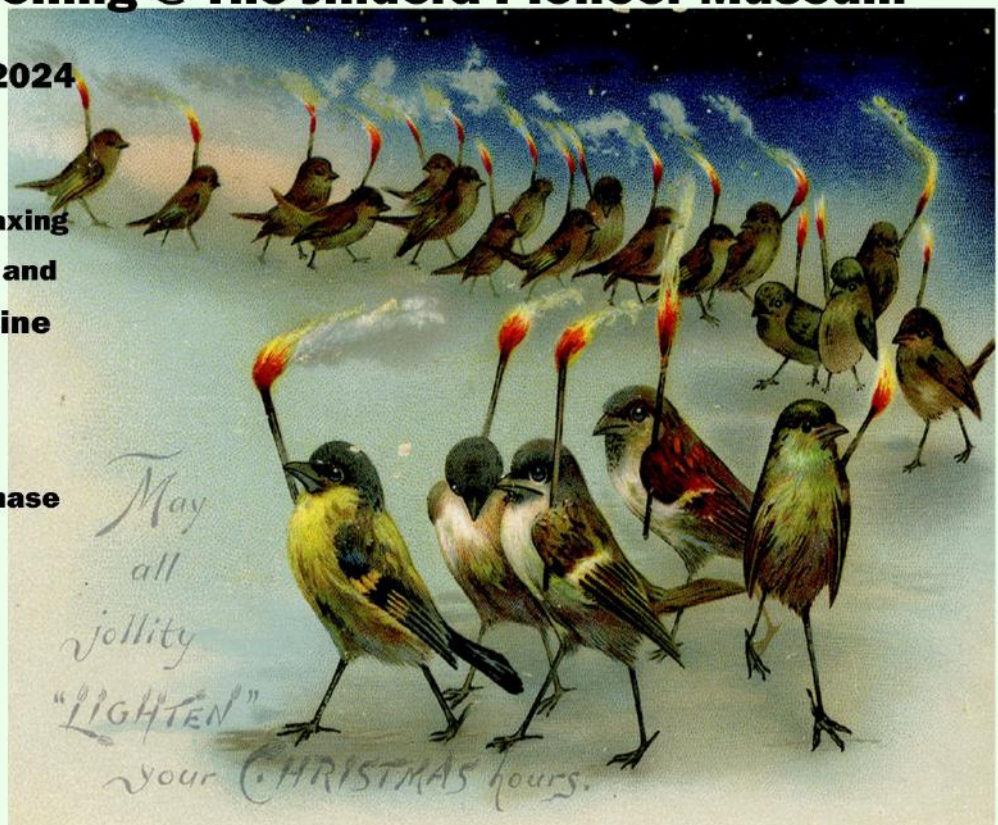

Burrumbuttock Endurance Riders Easter Carnival



HELPERS WANTED for HORSE EVENT

In a first for our region a **100 kilometre endurance ride** is to be held over the Easter weekend at the end of March. Up to **150 entrants** are expected to arrive, along with three or four support staff for each rider. And that means a large contingent of helpers will be required on the ground, if the event is to be run efficiently and successfully.

Competitors will begin arriving at the **Burrumbuttock Recreational Ground** on Good Friday, have familiarisation meetings rides on Saturday, ready for the main event on Sunday.

The ride will have several sections, allowing riders of different abilities to be competitive, with the top riders competing for international ranking points. Seven veterinary surgeons, including one from overseas, will monitor the condition of the horses at various check points around the course. For anyone just interested in watching the ride, viewing points will be available. The main ride starts at 6 am, with the quickest horse expected to finish in seven or eight hours, while the slower ones will be as much as several hours behind them.

Helpers are wanted for Saturday afternoon and all day Sunday, for tasks such as gate control, time keeping, vet assistance, competitor check point counting and others.

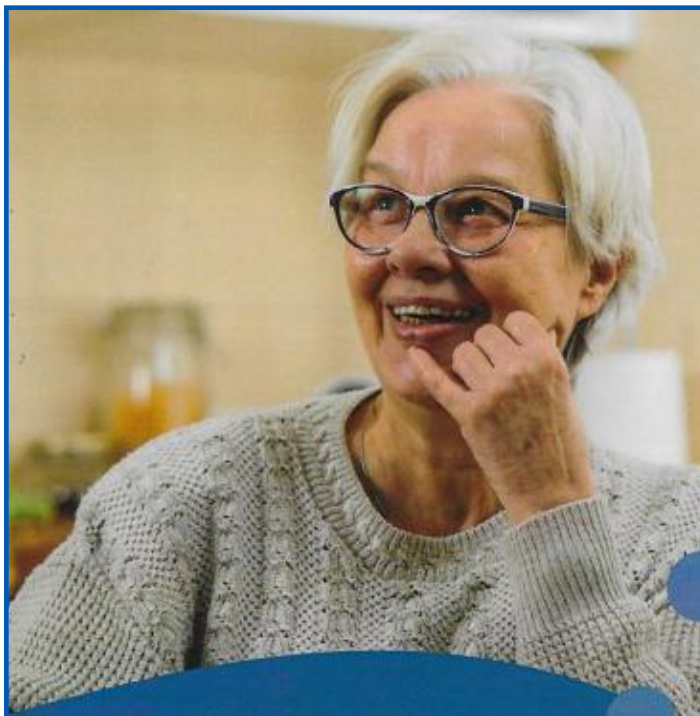
We service Walla Walla, Burrumbuttock, Gerogery and Jindera to Albury on one of these routes, Monday through Friday (except public holidays). We generally leave Walla at around 7.00am at the start of each day. Customers ring 0448 353 281 the day before to make a booking. We are an 'on demand service' which means we pick you up from your door and drop you off at your specified destination. We try to accommodate departure and arrival times for passengers as best we can. We generally leave Albury at around 6.00pm each day for the last run back to Walla via Jindera.

The other service we provide is Holbrook to Albury via Culcairn and Gerogery Monday, Wednesday and Friday. On Thursday this service collects and returns passenger to Henty. The Holbrook bus goes to Wagga on Tuesday via Henty, Uranquinty and The Rock.

Full fare from Walla to Albury is \$7.20 one way, **Jindera full fare is \$4.90**, but do let the Regional Bus team know if you have a concession card or senior card as this reduces the cost of travel considerably. **Senior** card holders are only **\$2.50** for the whole day!

We transport school children to after school sports, tutoring or jobs. We pick up from the airport and train station. We drop people off to get their cars serviced. We take people to play Bingo or table tennis. We take people in for their shopping, medical appointments, TAFE or uni.

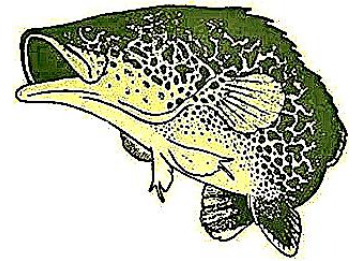
