Our interest in artists led us to explore different creative expression ways; we enjoyed Pablo Picasso's bold colours, lines, and shapes. Each child at Little Saints was encouraged to participate in our beautiful Pablo's design and final look. The hard work, research and love we put into this paid off.

LOOSE PARTS

At Little Saints, we took the exciting plunge into the world of loose parts play, setting up an inviting play area stocked

with a bounty of versatile items for our children to explore and engage with. One standout item has been the gold curtain rod holders, which might seem like an odd choice for a children's play area in most contexts, but the creative wonder of our children has truly been astonishing.

These everyday items have been transformed in play using children's imagination, taking on roles as soldiers from England, Kings and Queens, shiny trophies, and supportive pillars for grand buildings and bridges. The range of imaginative play was inspiring and has been a joy to watch. Our resourceful team has also found imaginative uses for cardboard boxes, wooden rings, and pieces of cut material, which is further testament to the immense creativity pouring out in these loose parts of play space.

Inspired by the gold curtain rod holders, it's apparent that the children are brimming with creativity. They are forming and extending their ideas and building their understanding of the world around them through imaginative play *(EYLF Outcome 4: Children are confident and involved learners)*.

The cardboard boxes, wooden rings and cut material usage demonstrate their ability to create and design, highlighting their abilities to problem solve, innovate and think critically.



Our children's engagement in loose parts play presents numerous opportunities for creativity & lays a foundation for mathematical and scientific concepts. Physically manipulating objects allows them to understand differences in size, weight, quantity and even basic principles like cause and effect. This valuable learning aligns with EYLF Outcome 5: 'Children are effective communicators'.





PROJECT WORK

The Little Saints children found a beautiful, unattended spiderweb.

We were so captivated by how fine and "cool" this looked. We had so many questions about the web:

- "How do spiders make their web?"
- "Why do they have a web?"
- "Can we make a web?"

This led to us exploring weaving concepts and how we can achieve this idea. Our friend drew pictures of spider webs and their interpretations of how it was made. We started noticing how the lines formed and how the circle was weaved. We tied some sticks together and tried weaving the wool through the posts to create this pattern.

This was working beautifully, and the children showed happiness with this. But it broke, so a discussion broke out about how to make it stronger and more prosperous for all children to participate. The children suggested "in the trees like how we found the web" " but we couldn't find a tree to make it work.

We then found the tyre in our climbing area is round, just like the spider web. This led us to use wool to wrap around the tyre and explore threading and weaving concepts on a larger scale. This proved more successful; our friends continued this interest the whole morning, and we will continue looking at spiderwebs for the remainder of the term.



SENSORY PLAY

During indoor/outdoor play in the little yard, the children have been exploring the concept of ice melting. An Educator supplied the children with large square pieces of ice with cut-up lemon slices throughout them.

Some children picked mint leaves from the garden to add to their lemon ice cube mixtures. Patiently waiting for the ice to melt, the children used sticks, spoons, and their fingers to pull the lemon slices out.

Playing with ice is an excellent way to give children a fun and stimulating sensory experience.

This play supports development in crucial learning areas like fine motor skills, cognitive skills, emergent science, and language development.




Rhonda Walmsley thanked Bernard for the amazing photography and presented him with a Probus pen as a token of our appreciation.

October has been a great fishing month for the dedicated anglers prepared to take on some very varied weather conditions, temperature ups and downs and lots of very windy conditions.

Those venturing up to into the mountain country have done very well with trout catches and it isn't rocket science, bunch of scrubbies or garden worms on the bottom off the bank will do the trick.

Catches of redfin and yellowbelly have been reported at the weir, just a matter of perseverance and the more you fish the luckier you get, fishing at the weir will only get better as the warmer more stable weather arrives.

Jindera anglers held their October comp to coincide with the Leigh Martin Fishing Classic at Lake Hume on the 20th, 21st and 23rd of October with many club members fishing both comps.

Winner of the best fish went to Kevin Brown who fished Blowering Dam and managed to snare a 98cm Murray cod (released), and before you question closed cod season, Blowering is open for cod fishing as is Lake Eilden, best bag of fish was won by Zol Peli with a good bag of redfin with the biggest around the 30mm mark, Laz caught 5 redfin and the general consensus was fishing was hard work and a bit dangerous with very rough water conditions.

Next fishing comp will be an **Open Comp** held from **5pm on Friday, 17th November** with the weigh-in at the clubhouse at 5pm on **Sunday, 19th November**.

The December comp will coincide with cod Opening, commencing on Friday, December the 1st from 5pm,

NOTE: anyone catching fish prior to 5pm Friday and trying to weigh them in will be disqualified and beaten to a pulp with a dead fish.

Weigh-in time and the Christmas Party arrangements will be discussed at the **next general meeting** to be held at 5.30 on **Friday**, **10th November**.

Anglers are also reminded that they have to the **17th November** to comment on the **trout cod recovery plan**, it is important, so read it and have your say, key areas for me of the trout cod overpopulating the Murray River down Cobram way and also the closed water in that region.

The other problem in the river below Mulwala is the trout cod are aggressive feeders, that will be a problem for Murray cod now and into the future. One thing that is for sure there are plenty of trout cod around the 12 mile reserve and they also appear to be going well in the upper Murray.


