hold items, and machinery stretching back 150 years.

But there is the opportunity to use this collection to provide visitors with more than a display of our local and family history. There is the opportunity to tell the story of how our culture and community have changed over 150 years.



That is why Jindera Pioneer Museum & Historical Society needs Jindera and the district communities' help to build an

educational facility just south of the original Wagner's store.

Our museum has a unique collection, but it is underutilised. It can offer a very, very different experience to what you would find in a metropolitan museum.

At **Jindera Museum** there is a story behind everything.

The new building will enhance the educational facilities. It will include a costume space, a hands-on activity area, and a shop. Visitors will become immersed in 150 years of culture and community.



While the Museum already plays host to thousands of visitors each year, undercover space is limited. So, when a school or a large group visits, the people have few spaces to shelter or have lunch. The new facility will include a large undercover area for groups.



A new facility like this will encourage visitation to our town and have flowon effects to other local businesses.

Support YOUR Local Business The **Jindera Pioneer Museum** that sits in our community, is exceptional in quality and authenticity.

There are lots of stories waiting to be told. Spread over 25 stunning rooms and galleries in 7 heritage precincts, sto-

ries include:

• A small wattle and daub hut, probably built around 1840, that gives visitors a glimpse of life before the German settlers came to the district. It is probably the oldest remaining cottage or house in the Albury District.

• The original Wagner's store and three-room residence, which was built in 1874: the original shop is now the Tea Room. The house was extended as the owners family grew and this large residence has been painstakingly furnished to recreate its 19th-century affluent appearance. The large Wagner's Store building, built in 1906, is pre-eminent in NSW for its original shop fittings and furnishings. It's a story of what our local 'corner shop' once looked like.





• There is also an extensive section of historically significant machinery that tells the story of how farming has changed in the region (including the new Working Machines Shed with operational small motors, pumps and tractors)







The change will mean a visit to our museum will be distinct from others. It will be more than looking at things behind glass cases.

It will be a place of imagination... back to those early days: when life was both difficult and happy, and work could be both backbreaking and heartbreaking.

SPRING in JUNDERA WETLA



Although the photo's accompanying this article are black and white a visit to the Woodland area of Jindera Wetlands will reveal that the originals are of a range of spring colours. There are yellow wattles in abundance, purple Hardenbergia Hardenburgia, and if you search you may find what I call an orange and red "eggs and bacon' plant. There is also plenty of fresh green growth among the grasses and shrubs. Of course, the weeds are green too!







Nearly all of the plants you can see on a visit to the Wetlands were put in by Jindera school children three years ago! They can feel proud of their efforts now showing in spring colours.

Three years ago, the school kids also sampled the then shallow water in the Wetlands and found only a limited but interesting range of aquatic life. Perhaps the present 'flood level' in the wetlands will have encouraged other aquatic species to thrive. For instance, Heron birds on their spring visits have been seen darting their beaks into the shallows to feast on small fish!



Among the anti-erosion rocks in

wet winter should have given them a good chance to establish.

the water-course running beside the woodland area are a few Lomandra longifolia plants. They favour wet areas and the past

The row of staked Kurrajong species in the photos are planted in memory of my brother Chris who died unexpectedly last December. The Kurrajongs are locally prorated varieties which will produce either pink

or red flowers. During his many visits to Jindera Chris always visited the wetlands.

Chris was a forester who spent much of his working life in the Kimberly in north-west WA. Boab trees, which are related to Kurrajongs trees grow in abundance there. Hence the photographed Kurrajongs are planted as a memorial to my late brother.

Unfortunately, we have again been hampered by Covid Lock-downs, but hopefully, as we ease out of the clutches of the virus, we will see less closed doors. The museum is so fortunate, being as large as it is, that visitors are able to keep their social distance easily.

The outdoor areas also provide a great space for family groups and friends to meet and bring lunch during the week or partake of the wonderful home-cooked fare on Sundays when the museum Tea Room is open. The advent of Spring is very evident in the garden at the museum and everything is looking beautiful.

The concrete path replacement is nearly complete and then this section of the garden will be able to be put back into some kind of order. Some additional paving will be undertaken soon providing a firm surface to the Wattle and Daub Cottage. As development continues, a hard surface path will be constructed to the toilets and Working Machines Shed.

Refurbishment of the Marge Wehner Gallery is now almost complete with the paintings repaired and reinstated in a new combination. The pianola has pride of place on the east wall and cataloguing of many of the items in cabinets has been completed by Chris our Curator. Paul and Ian did a great job re hanging the paintings and the space is looking fresh and bright with its new paint job.

Thank-you to all who attended the working bee and helped place (very heavy) cabinets back in position and clean windows and cases.

Although inhibited by lockdowns, the boys in the Working Machinery Shed continue to push on with projects and the Moline Tractor is nearly back in one piece. Restoration of the motors in many of these old machines is an arduous task as parts are no longer available. Any new piece has to be created, build from scratch and then incorporated into the machine with the hope that it will work. There is quite a bit of trial and error involved and a great deal of patience.

The collection of "working" machines has created an interest outside our older horse drawn collection of machinery and it provides great interest when these machines are functioning.

We are hopeful that with the increased level of vaccination in NSW we may have seen the end of lockdowns. We are hopeful that we may be able to hold our High Tea scheduled for Sunday 24th October and we may even squeeze in the Italian Long Lunch before Christmas. October sees the countdown to Christmas, and we hope this year we will be able to spend it with family

and friends. Remember, as the weather improves, the museum is a great place to visit, with plenty of open space, lovely gardens and fabulous exhibits to interest




everyone in the family. The Tea Rooms provide a tasty array of home-cooked goodies, available every Sunday from 11am.





COUNCIL NEWS September 2021

The meeting was recorded and available for viewing on Council's website https://bit.ly/35uKFxX

Business dealt with at the meeting included:

Council resolved to write to the NSW Government to withdraw the Environmental Planning and Assessment Amendment (Infrastructure Contributions) Bill 2021 from NSW Parliament. Additionally, Council will call on the NSW Government to undertaken further consultation with the local government sector on any proposed reforms to the infrastructure contributions system. Council will also seek a meeting with Justin Clancy, Member for Albury, to discuss the likely impact the Bill will have on Council, our community and ratepayers.

Cr Doug Meyer OAM was voted as Deputy Mayor which was put to open vote at the Council meeting.

Council resolved to submit an amendment to the *Greater Hume Local Environmental Plan 2012 – Zoning and Minimum Lot Size Changes for 151 – 159 Pioneer Drive Jindera and 1037 Urana Road, Jindera* to the Department of Planning, Infrastructure and Environment to facilitate large lot residential land and seek a conditional Gateway Determination.

The draft Jindera Residential Land Use Strategy will be re-exhibited, following requests from three landowners seeking inclusion in the strategy.

Following on from the postponement of the 2021 elections, Council agreed the meeting schedule for the remainder of the calendar year and January 2022 (below).

Week commencing 10 January 2022 Holbrook Council reaffirmed its delegates for various organisations/ committees where Council is represented for the remainder of the Council term.

Council will enter into a Partnership Agreement with Service NSW for Business. Service NSW for Business provides free, personalised support to small business owners, to help them understand industry regulations, to guide them through transactions, and to access support.

The 2020-2021 Financial Statements were adopted as presented.

The Greater Hume Energy Savings Action Plan (ESAP) was adopted. The ESAP has identified that

initiatives undertaken to date have resulted in a 48% reduction of net electricity usage.

Council agreed that the operation of the Greater Hume Disability Inclusion Action Plan 2017/2021 will be extended to the period 30 June 2022.

Council will accept the offer from Inland Rail to relocate the top span of the Culcairn Rail Footbridge to Eric Thomas Park in Culcairn.

Council are currently reviewing the Community Strategic Plan. There are a number of opportunities for the community to contribute to the development of the plan. The QR code will take you to the survey on our website. The website also advises other means to engage with us.


