Make a Bushfire Survival Plan - Prepare yourself and family

- Preparation isn't just about cleaning up around the house and having a bush fire survival plan.
- It is also about considering your physical, mental and emotional preparedness.
- A bush fire can be a terrifying situation. Strong gusty winds, intense heat and flames will make you tired quickly.
- Thick heavy smoke will sting your eyes and choke your lungs. It will be difficult to see and breathe.
- The roaring sound of the fire approaching could be frightening. Embers will rain down, causing spot fires all around you. Power and water may be cut off.
- You may be isolated, and it will be dark, noisy and extremely demanding both mentally and physically.

Leaving early is always your safest option.





PLANTING PLANTS at the Jindera Wetlands



As we move closer to **bush fire period**, it is great to see so many notifications of burns coming in. As a result, neighbours and community are aware of impending burns and unnecessary callouts have been kept to a minimum.

The statutory **bush fire period** runs from 1 October to 31 March for most of NSW, however, as Jindera is part of the Southern Border area, our **fire season** runs from

1 November to 31 March.

The start and finish dates may vary depending on the weather. If conditions dry out earlier than normal, the start date can be brought forward or delayed if conditions are wetter

Keep an eye on the **electronic sign** at the fire station in Urana Street for regular updates.

Busy fire activity continues this month along the east coast with many areas experiencing high temperatures and strong winds resulting in the first catastrophic fire danger rating since the 2019/2020 season.

Make a Plan - Pack an Emergency Kit

- People who are at higher risk, such as children, elderly, disabled or with medical problems, should always leave early. And please don't forget about your pets. Leaving early is always your safest option.
- To help your family prepare for a bush fire, you need to make a <u>bush fire survival plan</u>. This will help you make important decisions like when to leave, what to take, and what to do with animals.
- You can assess your risk using the <u>bush fire household assessment tool</u>.

 Bushfire Survival Plan PACKS are available at the Jindera Hub Council Office in Urana Street.



A New Breed of Breeder!

When most of us think of a 14 year old boy, we don't picture the image of a Stud Poll Dorset Breeder?

But that's exactly what young Sam Williams is passionate about. He spends as much time as he can in the paddock with his beloved 'Ovis Aries'. Walking among them, observing them, teaching them that they have nothing to fear, giving them a pat or a head scratch. Sam gets to know them all individually. He can tell every ewe, lamb or ram apart.

"To me they all look different and they certainly have different personalities. They are not scared of me or my dogs because they are so use to us. That is the benefit of a stud. It is more personable and more refined."

From a very young age, Sam remembers being around sheep. His Grandfather had his own Stud Sheep Farm, and other family and friends also ran sheep.

"The turning point was when I was helping my cousin crutching. I found working with the sheep very rewarding and satisfying. From there my passion grew."



Sam and his family moved from near Ballarat to this area, looking for a warmer climate. They found the property 'Round Hill' at Culcairn. which Sam says... "has really a impressive Ram shed that once was a stud farm. I felt that it was the perfect opportunity to fulfill my dream, continue family tradition and honour the farm




to bring back stud farming to the property."

Since his birth, Sam's parents had put away \$20 per week for him, which was only to be used as an investment. He also worked with his Dad during holidays and during Covid, when the school went into lockdown, for some extra pocket money. When he received money for Christmas and birthdays, he saved it to put towards buying ewes.

At the age of 12 Sam purchased 26, 1 year old ewes and 2 rams. They came from the people who had purchased his Grandfathers stud so are from his Grandfathers breed line. From there it has grown and he is now ready to go to market with his first lot of rams that were born in 2022

"I have 19 rams to sell, and they are looking good. They scanned well and are from strong pedigree backgrounds"

There have been a few challenges to this point. The last two years excessively wet conditions, the current sheep market/prices and reaching out to clientele in a new area, for starters.





'Also my age. Still being teenager and having other commitments. Getting market to take me seriously when I am only a kid. But I know I have a great product and all the ability

and passion to make this work."

"My goal is to continue to breed a high standard of rams to supply a regular clientele base. Not necessarily to breed 100's of rams at this point, but definitely in the long term. And to warrant my own on farm sales so as to show case what I can do and the great facilities for stud farming in a highly productive farming area. I want to be successful and I want to do it well."



main body of the museum and Wagner's store. Blacksmith and Stables Grand Opening at Jindera Pioneer Museum

On Sunday 17th September, members and invited guests were able to finally view the Jindera 'blacksmith precinct', a full quarter acre of memorabilia attributed to 120 years of blacksmithing in Jindera. The collection of steel "bits" for this period of time attributed to the big job of clearing the site to make it safe and presentable. We have had several working bees just on the site and many more hours as well by several dedicated volunteers. We are now very pleased to present the site to the public for visitation. Inspection of the blacksmith precinct is included when you visit the museum site. If you just want to visit the blacksmith, purchase a token from the museum for \$5 which will give you access to the site.

A Brief History of the Blacksmith



Reinhardt Molkentin was the first blacksmith and wheelwright for the settlement but in 1885, when in his early 40's, he was involved in a fatal workplace accident. Harry Harberecht, business partner to Reinhardt, carried on the business until Reinhardt's two sons, Paul and Fred were old enough to run the blacksmith shop for their mother.

Ticketed blacksmith and wheelwright, Fred Wehner, arrived from Germany in 1890, following his brother. In 1892 he travelled to Walla Walla to work for the blacksmith there. Fred moved to Jindera in 1899 working in the Molkentin

business. Here he later met and married Bertha, sister to Paul and Fred. He took over the wheelwrighting at the Jindera black-smith in 1908. In 1915 Fred Wehner purchased the business from the Molkentin family and continued operating the business with his son Ernst. Fred died in 1957 and Ernie, or Frostie as he was known on the football field due to his white legs, operated as both blacksmith and wheelwright until his death in 1994.





Great weather, the fish are biting what could go wrong aaahhaaa flat battery 3 batteries later..... buga!


