In 2022, we formed the Carer Plus Group with the aim to provide 2-3 workshop events per year, based on identified topics or needs within the community and presented in a public forum. We have consciously decided to include a wider catchment area and provide events free of charge where we can.

We ran our Inaugural event last year 'Assisting Families to Find Hope in Grief and Loss' in the leadup to Christmas and are pleased to announce our second event, the 'Well-Being Workshop' to be held on Sunday 24th September 2023.

This is a FREE event, enabled by our success in receiving an Australia Post Grant, after being nominated by the Burrumbuttock Local Post Office. Our Grant project is "Supporting Mental Health and Wellbeing for Rural Families", aiming to bring community members together, and to make connections, as they gain a better understanding of how stress affects our wellbeing, and what we can do to address this.

We identified the need to recognise the state of rural and regional mental health and well-being, post-Covid, and with the growing effects of everyday pressures people are experiencing through cost of living, rising energy bills, etc., we want to highlight the broad range of ages that are affected when well-being drops. We encourage all ages to attend, with a particular desire to encourage young people from teenage years onwards. The worry of dealing with stress is very real, and the workshop aims to assist with practical ways to counterbalance stress in our lives.

We are especially lucky to have Sally Jean from 'Glow Well-Being' run our event, as she grew up in this region, and is now qualified in many different well-being and counselling modalities. She will combine a variety of approaches including activities and large group situations, but will provide options for small group interactions, creating age-appropriate discussion groups, where similar concerns or feelings can be comfortably and confidentially shared.

The day will begin with registration and Morning Tea at 9.30am, a break for lunch at 12pm and at

3pm, you will go home armed with a fabulous toolkit of practical advice, and your take-home Handbook.

We look forward to sharing this incredibly positive day and learning alongside you. We will also welcome any ideas you may have for future events.

Long Standing Committee Member taking a step back

Colleen Lord OAM has been a member of RCL for the best part of 20 years. She moved to the area from Sydney, after her marriage to Dr Brian Lord, then head of School of Environmental and Information Sciences at Charles Sturt University.

Colleen held the position of RCL President in 2014 & 2015, and Vice President from 2016 to 2020. She has been the Op Shop Co-ordinator for just on 5 years, taking over from Jenny White in 2018, and has been Co-ordinator of our 'Necessitous Circumstances' division for a similar time.

Colleen was the driving force behind moving the Op Shop and RCL operations in July 2017, from the old and then rather run-down premises, to where we are now situated, in the Jindera HUB (Greater Hume Council) building. Her foresight and tenacity with instigating and negotiating this move has been a great legacy to RCL.

Further to her positions on RCL Committee, Colleen has also been active on

the Committee's of the Jindera Swimming Pool, Jindera Multi Purpose Hall, Jindera School of Arts Hall and Jindera Red Cross.

In recent years, Colleen has had her fair share of personal struggles, but none of this has held her down from her passion to give and to support others in her local community. With help from her team and her trademark positivity and diplomacy, she has continued to oversee the management of our very successful little Op Shop and has also continued to co-ordinate assistance to many people experiencing hardship.

With increasing responsibilities at home, however, Colleen has decided to stand down from her positions on the RCL Committee.

She will still be involved with RCL as a member and volunteer, offering her experience and guidance to her successors as and if needed, and helping out in the Op Shop when she can.

Colleen grew up on a farm on the outskirts of Sydney with her parents and siblings and professes "I loved it and never wanted to leave".

She did Business studies at Gosford TAFE and then in her early 20s went working as a Jillaroo and Governess on remote rural properties in N.S.W.

After a couple of years, Colleen returned to Sydney and trained as a Radiographer and travelled throughout NSW with the Anti-TB Association. She later located herself into the town of Bourke in NSW where she worked at the Bourke Hospital with the Bush Brotherhood and other agencies supporting Aboriginal groups in the community.

After 9 years, and seeking a change of career, Colleen trained as a Beautician with Estee Lauder, which lead her to travelling Australia as Head Marketing Consultant for Revlon.

But in 1975, she went back to work at Margaret Reid Hospital at St Ives in Sydney, which lead to a long

career in Health Promotion. She moved on to Manly District Hospital where she also managed 300 "Pink Ladies" (volunteers) and set up two new units - one on



the education of youth about hospitals, and the other on health education.

In 1983 Colleen was appointed to the position of State Director of the Senior Adult Unit, NSW Department of Health, and worked in that capacity until 1991 when she established her own health promotion consultancy business - Healthy Lifestyle Health Promotion Services.

Colleen has developed numerous national healthy lifestyle programs, and has travelled extensively throughout Australia's regional and remote areas, as well as overseas, promoting the benefits of health and wellness for all.

For a time she worked with Odyssey Travel, entertaining groups of American Tourists on Norfolk and Lord Howe Islands, which is where she met her husband Brian, who was doing the same.

Colleen has conducted workshops for Veterans and Families of Veterans Counselling Service in the ACT and Victoria.

She is an accredited fitness instructor, and a Master Trainer for Pole Walking and Aqua Fitness and has received many honours and awards for services in health and wellness for the population of Australia.

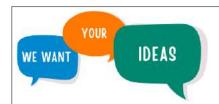

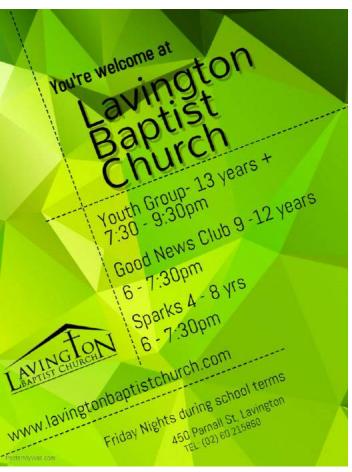

JIHDERA RÜRAL FIRE BRICADE

Wow ... September is here already, and the annual servicing of the brigade trucks and other equipment is nearing completion so the Jindera brigade is ready for the coming fire season.

The statutory bush fire period runs from 1st October 23 to 31st March 24

however, this may vary due to local conditions

ALL landholders and householders should also be preparing for the fire season by:

- removing rubbish from around buildings
- 🛱 cleaning out gutters
- 🛢 preparing any firebreaks required
- 🖺 limiting your property's exposure to fire.

A well prepared home is more likely to survive a bush fire. Even if your plan is to leave early, the more you prepare your home the more likely it will -

- 🛢 survive a bush fire or ember attack
- 🛢 be easier for you or firefighters to defend
- be less likely to put your neighbours homes at risk
- give you more protection if a fire threatens suddenly and you cannot leave.

Please remember to avoid unnecessary callouts by notifying your neighbours and the NSW Rural Fire Service of your intention to burn at least **24 hours prior** to lighting up — you can be fined for lighting up without notification. This month at the museum we see that Spring is emerging. The gardens look fabulous, thanks to the work of our gardening crew. We have created a new rose garden near the horse drawn and agricultural machinery shed. Many of these roses are from very old stock, so hopefully will survive the transplant. We have also moved

the CWA 100th anniversary bird bath to a sunnier position as we have also been entrusted with 3 of the roses developed especially for this CWA auspicious occasion. These have been planted around the birdbath and will hopefully do well in this sunnier position.



Many may have noticed the removal of 2 large trees along side the museum over the last few weeks. We have spent several days clearing up the timber from this major exercise, in between the rain which hasn't helped the site. This tree removal was necessary as we prepare for the new building which will occupy much of this site.

A new site plan is also being drawn up that will show the placement of the new building and the proposed future development of the museum site. As a committee we always need to be thinking how the site can be improved or developed. We cannot rest on the work that has gone before us, we always need to be looking forward to other opportunities to encourage people to visit.

As part of this ongoing development, the **blacksmith precinct**, directly opposite Wagner's Store, will be officially opened this month and visitors will be able to experience this whole new site from the **18th September**. Entry to the blacksmith precinct will be included with entry to the museum. A token will be issued that will allow entry through the turnstiles. These turnstiles were once how visitors entered the sports ground for sports events. The refurbished sheds to the rear of the blacksmith now houses buggies and sulkies, some from the original families that settled in the Jindera community.

There is also a collection of farm memorabilia from additional items required for the art of building and reconstructing cart and wagon wheels, an important part of the wheelwright's trade in this bygone era. Both rear sheds on the blacksmith site have been reconstructed, one funded by a government grant several years ago.



Part of the fencing was also covered by a federal grant, but the majority of the work has been completed with hard work by the museum volunteers. Years of filth and grim have been removed, part and parcel of a blacksmith, and many interesting items from the trade have been uncovered. Plaques will provide information on the trades (blacksmithing and wheelwrighting) and the history of the blacksmith on this site.

Many people are often totally surprised at the size of the museum when they visit. Many folk have only been to the museum when on excursion at primary school. The site has grown considerably over the years, with the addition of new displays and buildings.

This is why we have to continually look to find ways to raise funds. We have to provide new experiences so that people have a reason to visit not just once in their lifetime. It is a very different experience now to what it was even 10 years ago, and hopefully with continued support, it will continue to develop well into the future.

Many people don't realise the museum has to completely fund itself. It isn't supported by the government, other than if we are successful in applying for grants, which isn't often. It is very hard to secure a grant for a large amount which is what we need for the next step in our development, so we continue to fund raise and look for support.

A variety of opportunities will be presented to residents as alternate Christmas gifts in our November issue, so keep that in mind when next thinking about your Christmas gift list – give a lasting legacy, rather than something that ends up being recycled in 6 months or less.

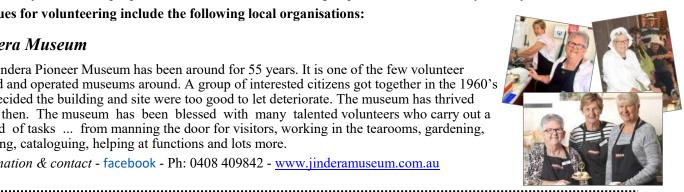

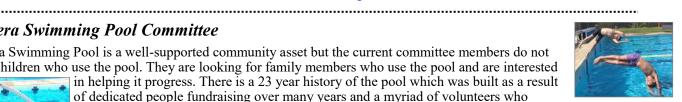

BIODIVERSITY in Our WETLANDS

Over the years Jindera Wetlands have become an attractive place to visit. Right now, the wattles are in full bloom and if you look carefully the purple Happy Wander is spectacular. Native grasses, Kangaroo Grass and Wallaby grass have both established well and look attractive.

Many of the plants have been planted by pupils from Jindera's three schools. Only last week year 5/6 from St John's Lutheran Primary School added more grasses and some long-wanted Rushes alongside the small watercourse which runs through the area adjacent to the woodland and which enters the wetland nearby.

Staff from Petaurus Education Group and West Hume Landcare assisted the planting exercise. A short talk about Biodiversity emphasised that Jindera wetlands are just that, 'bio-diverse' with many different forms of life, plant and animals inhabiting Jindera Wetlands.

After the planting exercise finished, a Bushy-tail Possum was discovered in residence in a nest-box in a woodland tree. Nearby was a Magpies nest, and Reed Warbles flittered among the water reeds. There is an abundance of frogs in the wetland ponds and St John's pupils learnt how to identify frog species using a mobile phone app.

Yes, as you sit and listen and watch, it is exciting to become aware of our Wetland's biodiversity.

But the Wetlands need ongoing management and development. Jack Healy and I are well beyond retirement age and are 'running out of steam'. 'New blood' is needed. Can you help? Weed control is an on-going issue; more pathways would allow better access and observation.

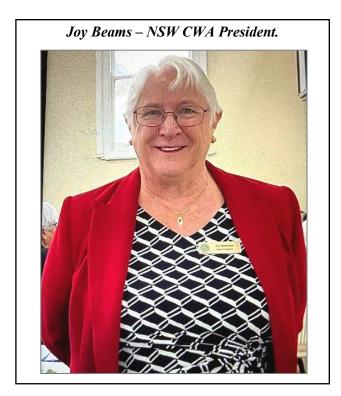
