The new library will also provide a range of programs and services offered at other branch libraries in the Greater Hume Council that include access to

public computers, borrowing, returning and reserving books and other resources.

Planned activities also include regular story time, holiday programs, Seniors Week, Grandparents Day, technology classes and outreach visits from Riverina Regional Library staff.

The branch library will also play a role as a hub for the community and literacy development for all.






Displaying the CWA State Handicraft Trophy, and their winning entries L-R Kay Thomson, Helen Glachan, Virginia Morey.





COUNCIL NEWS MAY 2019

Highlights from meeting held on 15 May at Holbrook:

In NSW Councils and insurers fund emergency services agencies in NSW, with councils required to pay 11.7 per cent of the budget required by NSW Emergency Services. These charges are embedded in council rates and insurance premiums. Greater Hume Council only recently received an invoice for \$510,068.70 for its 2019/2020 levy, an increase of \$97,689.70 more than last year's levy, representing an increase of 23.69%. Council resolved to write to the NSW Premier, and key Ministers to object to this unplanned increase. Council has asked the NSW Government to fund the first twelve months of this extra cost, and to work with councils to ensure a fairer implementation into the future.

Council agreed to refund development application fees of \$786 to the Walla Motoring Club.

In relation to a further request from the developer of the proposed Glenellen Solar Farm, Council did not accede to the developer's request that an amount of \$500,000 of the development contribution levy be allocated to the Jindera Multi-purpose Hall project.

Effectively this means that in the event that the Glenellen Solar Farm development is approved by NSW Planning (Council is not the consent authority), Council's earlier decision taken at the February 2019 meeting applies and Council agrees to enter into a Voluntary Planning Agreement (VPA), to receive a 1% contribution of the capital investment value of the proposed solar farm. Note that the VPA will only come into effect should approval for the Glenellen Solar Farm be granted by the NSW Department of Planning and Environment.

Council resolved to exhibit the Draft Waste Management Strategy. Residents can view the document at any council office or via Council's website, and have a say until 27 June 2019.

Highlights of the third quarter delivery plan performance report included:

- ✓ Achievement of additional funding of \$3.1m to enable the Henty Rail Crossing Relocation and Intersection project to proceed.
- ✓ Commencement of centre based of Long Day Care services at Henty and Walla Walla.
- ✓ Completion and replacement of stairs and viewing platform at Morgans Lookout

- ✓ Project management of a large number of projects funded under Rounds 1 and 2 of the Stronger Country Communities Fund.
- ✓ Free waste facility access day at all waste depots across the shire
- ✓ Hard Waste collection at Henty, Jindera and Walla Walla in conjunction with Holbrook Rotary and local football clubs.

A full list of achievements is included within the report.

Residents can view the 2019 Community Survey via Council's website.

Council also resolved to amend its Code of Meeting Practice and place the amended document on the website.

Council resolved to lobby and work with the Member for Farrer and mobile network operators to support the applications for funding for mobile base stations to eliminate black spot issues across the Greater Hume local government area.

Council received a report which provided an overview of the establishment of the new Riverina Joint Organisation (known as RivJO) which will in time replace the existing REROC (Riverina Eastern Organisations of Councils) structure. A draft strategic plan has been prepared for the RivJO.

Council's budget as at 31 March 2019 indicated a projected 2018/2019 cash surplus of \$22,048, an improvement of \$6,072 on the previous quarter.

Council resolved to prepare the necessary documents in preparation for the sale of land for unpaid rates.

Council accepted an offer of \$62,000 for Lot 109 Jarick Way Jindera Industrial Estate.

Finally the council authorised the General Manager to negotiate an offer to purchase land suitable for residential development at Culcairn, with a future report to come back to Council on the matter.

Next Council meeting will be held on 19 June at Culcairn.




GETTING ACTIVE IN JINDERA

Our year 9/10 Visual Art class had to design and make a terracotta sculpture, which had some practical function, in addition to aesthetic considerations. Once the initial design was complete, the students worked on them for several weeks. Once the sculpting was complete, we allowed them to dry for a little while, and then took them to St Paul's in Walla Walla, where their Visual Arts teacher was kind enough to fire them for us. Aside from a few minor casualties during the firing process, the final sculptures turned out very well.

This Term students enjoyed a visit from Questacon, who held a smart skills workshop for our year 6-12 students. We were also fortunate enough to have a Deadly Creatures visit. Students in both primary and secondary were lucky to have a talk on unique animals that live in Australia. Students were given the opportunity to hold non venomous snakes, lizards and turtles.









For Mathematics, Year 6 have been learning about interpreting and representing data in graphs. They had a lesson on finding the mean (average) of a set of numbers. The students went out onto the basketball court and recorded how many hops they could complete on one leg. They had to record three attempts and then calculate the mean of the number of hops on one leg. From the photos, you could easily mistake this lesson for a dancing lesson on Irish dancing! Whilst some were able to complete the hopping looking as graceful as swans, others found it so easy they could do it with their hands in their pockets.

The Year 11 Ancient History and Chemistry students went on an excursion to Lake Hume to conduct an archaeological dig as well as to assess the abiotic factors for life. The Chemistry students discovered the following: Air Temperature was 15c, Water temperature was 17.5c, and Humidity was 80%; Water pH was 7 (Normal.) with a medium level of chloride and a low level of sulphate detected.

The Ancient History students had an exciting time discovering 'hidden' civilisations out at Lake Hume. We discovered that there was a small civilisation which lived hundreds of years ago and based on our 'finding', we 'concluded' that this civilization was destroyed by a war based on the different coloured shotgun shells, a 'bow', and many other items located in the images below. Overall it was an enriching day.


