

NSW RURAL FIRE SERVICE



The Brigade has finally taken delivery of a replacement vehicle for our Personnel Carrier (PC). The vehicle is also the key chainsaw response vehicle in the Southern Border Team District. The old PC was damaged in a fireground incident and has taken nearly 12 months to be replaced.



Our old PC was affectionately known as the **Kitchen**. At the time the brigade purchased the original vehicle, many years ago, it was money either spent on fitting out the kitchen in our brigade station or purchased the vehicle. The vehicle won the debate but was then named the '**Kitchen**'. The brigade then had to raise a bit more cash to fit out the kitchen in the shed.

The new vehicle (*our renovated kitchen*) is fitted out with the new NSW RFS livery and markings which is vastly different to what we have had in the past. The vehicle also has a range of innovative technology fitted to it. This includes a Star Link mobile base station which provides us with Vehicle as a Node (VaaN) capability.





The VaaN gives the vehicle full Public Safety Network access through satellite technology. This vehicle can access the full suite of NSW RFS systems, including stronger radio communications when we are on a fire ground. It also provides greater mobile telephone coverage to the 4G and 5G networks. The technology also has the capability to provide internet access if our current fire shed access is affected by natural disasters or fires.

Over the coming weeks you will see our Captain driving the vehicle around the village as we make some final adjustments to the storage area to ensure we can have all our necessary chainsaw equipment ready to respond to anywhere in the Southern Border Team Area and beyond.

Our brigade training and maintenance session are every **second Saturday** morning from **8:00am** or give the captain a call on **0427 263414**.

"*The desert has no sympathy for you. I just want to have the feeling of: I did that. It was hard, but I did it*!"

She's racing in memory of her brother, who died by suicide, and fundraising for 'It's Okay Not to be Okay', a charity dedicated to mental health awareness and breaking stigma.





At the beginning of the term, the **5yo Kangaroos** were very lucky to have Jonas from Ghana Have Some Fun visit and perform with his African instruments. We learnt words from his native language and, using these newly learnt words, we participated in traditional call and response songs. Uncle Jonas taught us about the traditional African instruments, and we had the opportunity to play the instruments and dance. We sang songs and listened to stories, taking in the ways and culture of Africa. To follow on from this amazing experience, we are very excited to be exploring different realms of music during the term - listening to various genres and styles, connecting with music and ways to move our bodies in response, and experimenting with playing a variety of instruments.





This term the **4yo Wombats** are diving a rich and meaningful journey of emotional understanding, creativity, and connection with the world around us. Our Wombats are being introduced to the 'Zones of Regulation' through an interactive station that helps them tune into their feelings and build strategies to manage big emotions.

As the seasons shift, we've already noticed the magic of Autumn — *colourful leaves falling and changing* — sparking curiosity, creativity, and collaborative art experiences using natural materials.

We will connect further with the land as we explore bush walks in our environment around us.

We'll also be getting our hands dirty in the garden, planting vegetables and flowers while learning how to care for the earth with kindness and responsibility.

This term our **3yo Kookaburras** are focusing on our communication and language. We are building our knowledge of words and how to respond when we hear or see them.

Communication and language can look like gestures/actions, facial responses, behaviours, spoken words, key signs, visual cues or sounds. It is important that our children recognise and understand the value of communication and the impact it has on their environment and self. We are learning to recognise and respond to our verbal name. We are learning to keep ourselves safe and redirect others – ie **STOP** I do not like it! We are building our understanding of talking and listening through experiences with the Talking/ Yarning Stick and learning about participating in shared communication.





New Trees along Dight Street






Messy Play and Open-Ended Art

PROBUS - June Update

The Henty/Culcairn Probus group held its May ^(a) meeting at the Culcairn Bowling Club. The gathering was well attended.

The meeting's keynote speaker was Craig Broughton, who recounted the journey he and his wife Karen undertook after deciding to relocate f rom their Albury home rather than renovate. In November 2021, they purchased a 40-acre lot on Coach Road, which suited their needs, and started them on the odyssey of planning and building their new home.

After discovering that it would cost \$80,000 to get power to the property, they investigated going solar. They thus began their adventure and challenge of building a three-bedroom off-grid home that was as solar-passive as possible. In designing the house which looks like an old shearing shed, the Broughtons decided to use materials that don't require upkeep, including corrugated iron for the outside walls. The walls and ceiling are exceptionally well insulated, the windows are double-glazed, the whole house is wrapped, such that no air transfers from outside to inside or vice versa, and the rooms have high ceilings and ceiling fans.

Major windows face north to optimise the use of sunshine for heating. The house has polished concrete floors that capture heat during the day and release it in the evening to help heat it. The house's ambient temperature is between 18 and 20 degrees all year. The Broughton's supplement the solar heat in winter with a wood fire and have a split system for heating and cooling that runs from their stored power as a final backup. In summer, the doors are opened to create crosswinds for cooling, plus the ceiling fans for air circulation. The solar system comprises 48 solar panels that can generate up to 23.5 kWh daily, plus seven batteries for storage. With careful scheduling of major appliances, the Broughton's use less electricity than they generate.

The property only had five trees when purchased; however, over the past several years, Craig and Karen have planted 1,000 trees. These trees are reducing water runoff and erosion and providing habitat for wildlife. As well, a part of the property has been fenced off as a birding area. The couple also utilise a sustainable water approach for their extensive vegetable garden and orchard. While an off-grid home is not for everyone, Karen and Craig love theirs.

- Authorise the General Manager to sign the Service Level Agreement between Greater Hume Council and WAW Credit Union Walla Walla. More information in regards to the reinstatement of Council services at WAW Walla Walla will be provided in the following weeks.

- Place the draft Delivery Program 2025 2029 incorporating draft Operational Plan 2025-2026 and budget, draft Resourcing Strategy 2025-2029, draft Fees and Charges 2025-2026 on public exhibition and accepts submissions until Thursday 19, June 2025. Have your Say on the various documents here <u>https://shorturl.at/PXP24</u>.
- Advise TfNSW that Council objects to the proposed speed zone change on Dights Forest Road due to inadequate consultation with the community. Council will advise TfNSW to formulate a plan in order to appropriately consult with our community in regards to the proposed change.
- Give public notice of its intention for the leasing of the road reserve adjoining 19 Shea Road Mullengandra. Have your say on this proposed road lease here <u>https://shorturl.at/PXP24</u>.


