In 2013 the idea was mooted that Jindera should be conducting its own **ANZAC Day Dawn Service**. And from that idea the Jindera ANZAC Day dawn service was resurrected. The concept was that it was to be a simple service of remembrance and the service was designed with that purpose in mind.

The first service was attended by about 50 people and now, some ten years later, the Dawn Service's attendance has grown to well over 200 and also includes a Gun Fire Breakfast put on by the Jindera Fire Brigade. The Jindera Dawn Service continues to grow, now with some Albury residents making the trip to Jindera for the service.

The ANZAC Day service held at 10.30am, also saw a large crowd of 500 hundred plus participants, both old and young, attending here in Jindera. Excitement built up as a helicopter from our local company Forestair flew overhead which really added to the atmosphere. The Air Cadets Catafalque party paraded and stood at attention with great dignity.

Army Captain Neville Stott was the guest speaker. He commented on the immense pride and community spirit he sees on days such as ANZAC Day and spoke of the history of the Gallipoli action and how all servicemen and women who have died in action are remembered on this day.

Peter Martin, local resident, played The Last Post and The Rouse-Reveille.

Jindera is probably unique in the fact that the three local schools take it in turns to host ANZAC Day from year to year thus ensuing the interest and participation of our youth. St Johns School hosted the service this year.





Rural Care Link Inc. News

Jindera welcomes many visitors to the town for Garage Sale Day.

The 24th Annual Jindera Community Garage Sale was held on Sunday 23rd April.

Quote of the day.... "The weather was perfect" (23 and sunny).

It was reported that the early bird garage sale enthusiasts were true to form and were observed driving the streets pre-dawn. One site holder reported their first sale was at 6.45am. It was noted that people were not so frenzied as other years.

The maps were keenly sought after and the 200 printed were all gone by 11am requiring a reprinting of more maps. Overall, 240 Maps were sold from the Jindera Hub/Op Shop.

We had 50 sites registered on the Wednesday prior. This grew to over 60 sites in operation by Sunday. Late registrations have always been welcomed by contacting Rural Care Link.

Four participants this year, who had not registered, were encouraged to contribute the \$15 registration fee, as a community minded gesture. Most of the registration fee goes in advertising the event for the day through online media, local town newsletters, the Border Mail, Signage and posters, TV and Radio. Rural Care Link Inc. sincerely appreciated the articles in the Border Mail by Jodie Bruton and the talk back with ABC Goulburn Murray with Sandra Moon and Ray Terrill.

One stall holder reported that people told her they 'just love it'. At the map sales, we met people from Holbrook, Henty, Howlong, Killara, Tallangatta, Myrtleford and Wangaratta. We received a call from a person in Melbourne asking, 'how many houses are registered' and telling us that they are very excited as they come up and stay each year in Albury for the weekend, just to attend the Jindera Community Garage Sale.

People love it. Stallholders that group together reported having a great day enjoying each other's company. This was observed at one site where six different family members had a site together, and also at the Jindera Community Garden stall, out on the Walla Walla - Jindera Rd. Sitting, chatting, having fun and catching up with friends and neighbours was certainly the flavour of the day. People who haven't seen each other for months and years caught up on Garage Sale day.

Some of the more interesting sale items this year included carnivorous plants, a hexagonal pool table, air hockey and football tables, a portable ballet barre, gum boots, woolshed wooden gates (old), an industrial sewing machine, fowlers vacola, budgies, chooks, birds, kindling and silver ware.

A lady from Wodonga heard about the 'ballet barre' for sale on the talkback session with Ray Terrill on the ABC radio on Saturday and came specifically to Jindera to purchase this item for her granddaughter.

The 'kindling' sales were reported at being slow, but a chat with an acquaintance at the end of the day resulted in the sale of the lot with some very happy younger people reporting that their hard work spitting old pallets and bundling the kindling was worth the effort!

The rare and unusual hexagonal pool table was reported as an early sale, even though it was in poor condition.

As usual food and drink was a plenty. Thank you to Jindera Bakery for keeping up the coffees and food during the day. The fishing club did not disappoint. Their egg & bacon sandwiches were to die for. It was noted that the 'Multipurpose Hall' cake stall sold out quickly and the tea rooms at the Jindera Pioneer Museum were also kept on their feet.

A big thank you to all the Jindera residents who had a garage sale site and to the local community who got out and about on such a beautiful day.

Rural Care Link Inc. has recently taken up residence (i.e. is leasing) St John's Lutheran Chapel in Adams St, Jindera, as a second site to the current Op Shop.

The purpose of the second site has a few layers that may evolve over time. Firstly, it will allow us to now accept donations of furniture, which we have never had the space to accept in the past. It also doubles as our storage area, replacing two storage sheds previously rented in the industrial estate. This makes the management of sorting and re-stocking the main Op Shop much easier, simply due to the storage being closer in proximity to the existing shop.

The Chapel will also provide a private space for our Carers Group to meet on regular occasions.

To start with, the Chapel site will only be opened by appointment, for both donations and sales. Appointments can be made by contacting the Op Shop on 6026 3001 during their trading hours, or the Office phone 0475 594 073, which is manned continuously.

Our normal Op Shop hours remain the same. Open from Tuesday to Friday, 10am to 4pm with lunch break 1pm to 1.45pm. Open Saturdays from 10am to 1pm.

During April our shop had extremely successful bag sales, which helped to clear our Summer clothing.

We are gradually changing over to Winter stock, albeit a little slower than usual due to our big changes.

From 9th to 20th May we will have bric a brac on sale. Also, all of our Jigsaws, which we continue to have an enormous amount, will be half price.

You'll always find a treasure and/or a bargain in our shop, and don't forget to keep an eye on our face-book page for interesting items.







DISCUSSION WITH GREG BLACKIE (GHC) AT MEETING 18 APRIL 2023:

<u>Jindera/Dight Street Flooding</u> – The works on the Jindera Street drainage are now on hold with the Lutheran Church sub-division held up due to rules changing re tree removal – re-designing of sub-division being carried out to work around the trees, but still include a new drain. Adams Street work has been done to help alleviate flooding on Jindera Street/Adams Street corner and behind Preschool. Further drainage works planned for further west of Jindera Street – depending on future grant applications. Council not planning to clean out current drain due to tree removal issue but will continue to sandbag the problem flooding area. Gutter and road surface (front of new Post Office) – Council planning to fix area in front of building and also repair ongoing road surface problem.

New playground – Works to begin in 2 weeks with upgrade to 4 stall toilets. Funded by Crown Land grant (toilets) and sales of land (playground). Paths to be constructed from toilets to playground and out to Urana Street.

Molkentin Road/Urana Street intersection drainage works – Culverts currently in rec ground to be put in place to divert water under south side of Molkentin Road. Kerb and channel and footpath now too expensive from Urana Street to Cade Court – current drain to be filled and piped in the interim to allow walking on gravel footpath. Suggestion for JCF to request funding in future budget.

Jelbart Road – Roadworks now pushed back another 12 months to 2 years time.

POSITION OF JINDERA COMMUNITY FORUM SECRETARY:

At the end for the Forum Meeting Kathy Anderson announced that she would be retiring as the Forum's Secretary. Chairman Pat Hayes thanked Kathy for her more than 10 years of service as Secretary. This was followed by applause to Kathy by the members of the Forum present.

Peter White was nominated and accepted the position as the new Forum's Secretary.





Early in Term 2 we will complete our school athletics carnival.












Schools and Community Lay Wreaths



The museum had a wonderful day for the Autumn **High Tea** at the beginning of this past month. Many of our regular, loyal customers returned, but we also welcomed a new group of visitors, which was lovely to see. The day was 'picture perfect' and the feedback very positive on a wonderful day. Our group of helpers as always, did a fabulous job, both front and back of house, and we were pleased that all enjoyed a great day.

This past month we have also begun to look at ways to increase our profile, particularly in the Albury Wodonga market. We have had a professional photographer visit the museum and we now have a fabulous array of amazing photos to use in promotional situations. Thank-you to all of those that participated in the photo-shoot on the day. We plan to have an advertisement put together to screen in the local cinema, so if you are a movie buff, keep an eye out for that in future visits.

The committee have spent time in the last month looking at our future maintenance work, which is always an on -going concern. With a building as old as ours, we are always plagued with things that need fixing – repairing or replacing. 

Car Club - Swap Meet & Show N Shine held at Jindera Recreation Reserve


"What a massive day it was when the Morgan Country Car Club held its 26^{th} Annual Swap-Meet / Show & Shine at the end of March.
